Title

Honoring the work and dedication of City of Madison employees involved in fighting the record snowfall this year.

Body

WHEREAS, the City of Madison has already broken its all-time record for snow accumulation in

a single season, surpassing the 76.6 inch record set in 1978-79 with a snowfall this season of 86.7 inches and counting; and

WHEREAS, measurable snow has fallen in Madison 44 of 84 days this season and counting, requiring City workers to spend numerous weekends and evenings away from their families all winter; and

WHEREAS, City workers have tackled the challenge of this year's difficult weather with great dedication, spending long hours out in the cold and in physically demanding conditions to get the job done; and

WHEREAS, response to the winter weather has been a citywide effort, relying upon everyone from Streets Division equipment operators who drive the plows to Fleet Services mechanics to keep our trucks on the road;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Common Council express their appreciation for the hard work and dedication of all the workers throughout City government who have helped fight the record-breaking snows this winter; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that anyone who starts talking next summer about how they miss the cold and snowy winters of "the good old days" perhaps think twice before doing so.
