Dear Mr. Reid:

The one-lot certified survey combining the University of Wisconsin's property located at 115 N. Mills Street, Section 23, Township 7N, Range 8E, City of Madison, Dane County, Wisconsin, is hereby **conditionally approved**. The site is zoned [unrecorded] PUD-GDP-SIP as is part of the proposed Charter Street Heating Plant renovation and expansion project. The conditions of approval from the reviewing agencies to be satisfied before final approval and recording of the CSM are:

- For clarification purposes only: Engineering Mapping suggests that the surveyor depict on the final Certified Survey Map any lease or ownership configuration and recording information for portions of the mainline railroad corridor adjacent to this property on the north similar to how the pending lease is currently represented on the Wisconsin Department of Transportation-owned railroad spur corridor on the south side of this property.
- 2. The CSM shall be revised to establish a 20-foot easement for public storm sewer, centered on the existing pipe along the south lot line.
- 3. Wisconsin Administrative Code A-E 7.08 identifies when Public Land System (PLS) tie sheets must be filed with the Dane County Surveyor's office. The developer's surveyor and/or applicant must submit copies of required tie sheets or condition reports for all monuments, including center of sections of record, used in this survey, to Eric Pederson, City Engineering Division. If a new tie sheet is not required under A-E 7.08, Engineering requests a copy of the latest tie sheet on record with Dane County Surveyor's office. The applicant shall identify monument types on all PLS corners included on the plat or CSM. Note: Land tie to two PLS corners required.
- 4. In accordance with Section s.236.34(1)(c), which says a CSM shall be prepared in accordance with s.236.20(2)(c)&(f), the applicant shall show type, location and width of any and all easements. Clearly identify the difference between existing easements (cite Register of Deeds recording data) and easements which are being conveyed by the CSM. Identify the owner and/or benefiting interest of all easements.

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5. Prior to City Engineering final sign-off by the main office of the CSM, the final CSM shall be submitted to the Engineering Division Surveyor/ Land Records Coordinator for final technical review and approval. This submittal shall occur a minimum of two working days prior to final Engineering Division signoff. Electronic mail submittal of the final CSM in PDF form is preferred. 6. Note: All operating private wells shall be identified and permitted by the Water Utility in accordance with MGO Section 13.21. All unused private wells shall be abandoned in accordance with MGO Section 13.21.

Please note that the City's Office of Real Estate Services is reviewing the report of title provided with this survey and may have comments. That office will send any comments to you by fax or e-mail. If you have any questions, please contact Jeff Ekola at 267-8719 for more information.

A resolution approving the CSM and authorizing the City to sign it and any other documents related to the proposed land division was approved by the Common Council on <u>August 3, 2010</u>.

As soon as the comments and conditions have been satisfied as verified with a completed affidavit form (attached), the original along with the revised Certified Survey Map, with all signatures and approvals from the reviewing agencies, shall be brought to this office for final signoff. You or your client may then record the certified survey at the Dane County Register of Deeds. For information on recording procedures and fees, contact the Register of Deeds at 266-4141.

Upon acceptance and recording of the certified survey map by the Dane County Register of Deeds, please transfer the recorded volume, document number, and page numbers to the copies and forward a copy to this office for our records. The original survey map with the recording information is permanently kept on file in the Dane County Register of Deeds Office. A copy of the recorded document can be obtained from the Register of Deeds Office, Room 110, City-County Building or the Real Estate Office in the Madison Department of Planning and Development.

Any appeal from this action, including the conditions of approval, must be filed with the Circuit Court within 30 days from the date of this letter. **The approval of this CSM shall be null and void if not recorded in two years from the date of the approving resolution.** If you have any questions or if may be of any further assistance, please do not hesitate to contact my office at 261-9632.
