RE: Assessable Curb & Gutter Replacement in Conjunction with Street Resurfacing - 2009

The City of Madison is proposing to resurface approximately 10 miles of existing pavement in 2009.

A Notice of Public Hearing on the proposed work and the assessment showing the estimated quantity and cost to the individual property owner is printed on the backside of this letter. City Engineering will make a short presentation on the proposed work at the January 21, 2009 Public Hearing at the Board of Public Works.

A complete list of the roadways proposed for Street Resurfacing in 2009 and proposed estimated assessments are available for review at the following link http://www.cityofmadison.com/engineering/constructionStreets.cfm.

The resurfacing program includes three phases: Replacement of deteriorated curb & gutter, drive apron and sidewalk; milling or pulverizing the existing pavement; and placement of a new surface. Work is coordinated to minimize the time between each phase and minimize inconvenience to properly owners. It may also be necessary to trim tree limbs and/or roots to accommodate the construction and minimize stress on the trees. Disturbed terrace areas will be restored with topsoil, seed and mulch. Property owners and tenants can help by watering the newly seeded areas. Water lightly every day until the grass has been mowed once or twice. This will also help prevent weeds from establishing.

Resurfacing will start in early May and run through November. At this time there is no schedule for the work on your street. Streets will remain open to traffic during construction. Driveway access will be maintained as often as possible. In some instances driveway access will need to be removed to facilitate construction of the curb & gutter, drive apron and sidewalk. The contractor will provide notice to the property 48 hours prior to eliminating access.

The City assumes the entire cost of the improvements to the pavement and the replacement of curb & gutter and sidewalk ramps at intersections. Abutting property owners are assessed 50% of the cost to remove and replace curb & gutter, drive apron and sidewalk adjacent to their property.

Mr. Ron Loresch, of my staff, is the Inspector for this project. The Inspector's role is to ensure the City's standards for construction are met and to help resolve any problems arising during construction. Questions regarding the proposed improvements or your estimated assessment may be directed to Mr. Loresch at 266-4914. If you have questions during construction, you can reach him in the field at 267-1181 and after the beep, dial 705362.
