Al,

Here is my list of questions regarding the sign ordnance:

Typos:

31.03 Rules and defintions (about page 7)

Nonconforming Sign, "Any sign THAT does not comply..."

Nonconforming Use, "Any use of land or buildings THAT does not comply..."

thanks - we will correct the typos.

Questions / Drawing request:

note: the changes to the UDC Comprehensive Design section of the sign code (31.043) have ALREADY been approved by the UDC and adopted by the Council a few weeks ago, in a separate ordinance sponsored by Ald. Tim Bruer. See ID# 09802, you can search for it at

http://legistar.cityofmadison.com/mattersearch/home.aspx . The changes to the Comp Design section were accelerated at Bruer's request , approved by UDC and are already in effect - although the numbering system in the existing code is different than what you see in our draft. The "Bruer" changes can be found in sec. 31.04(2)(b)2.b. and shown in ID# 09802. 31.04(2)(b)2.b. will be renumbered 31.043 in the pending draft. So any questions about sec. 31.043 are coming late. We will try to answer them anyhow to make sure you have a good understanding of what the changes meant:

31.043 UDC and CDR (page 15)

(2)(a) - Regarding the 25% net area allowance, what are the maximum dims before allowable exceptions? Drawings of maximum allowed (no allowance) and with 25% allowance.

The maximum dimensions (without a variance) depend on what kind of sign it is, what district, etc. The max dimensions for each type of sign are found within the code section for that sign. For example: Wall signs, see 31.07 and Table 1 (which is found at sec. 31.15(1).) Ground signs, see 31.08 and Table 1.

(2)(a) - "...prevailing speeds..."

Q: What are the defined speed/size relationships?

currently the relationship is as expressed in Table 1. however this concept is one of the topics the UDC wants to re-open / discuss / explore.

What are these based on? we don't know what they are based on. Presume the drafters of the original Table 1 used some data or factors.

Specifically, are they based on empirical evidence, rules of thumb, tradition, or... what? not sure.

- (3)(b) "Permit the use of above-roof signs...deem their use appropriate."
- Q: What is the standard or criteria for this judgment call? the criteria are built into this subsection, 31.043(3)(b)

I presume visibility from some spot(s) is involved. What is this spot(s)? see the criteria within this subsection

(3)(c) Architecture...does not provide a reasonable signable area;

Q1: What is "reasonable"? I suspect my reasonable and a business owner's reasonable may be

very different. It is the UDC's job to determine and reach a consensus on what is considered architecturally / aesthetically reasonable, balanced with the "need" of the business owner to have signage.

- Q2: Does this apply to new and existing buildings? If so, I would suggest we limit its use to existing buildings, not new. as written there is no distinction. If UDC wants to make this only available to new construction, we can add that.

- (2) Portable Signs...
- Q: I don't understand "hand carried signs". Does this mean signs that must be held up by a person to be visible, like a picket sign? **YES**

Or does this mean a sign of a size and weight that a person can easily and safely carry it, like a sandwich board? the ordinance doesn't establish criteria for weight or ability to carry, but this is self-defined. a "hand carried" sign must be capable of being carried by hand. a sandwich board that is worn on the body would likely qualify as a hand-carried portable sign.

(2)(a) 2. Number...

Q: How are requests from 2 or more tenants from the same building handled? the ordinance specifies a maximum of 2 total signs, period. doesn't matter how many tenants.
