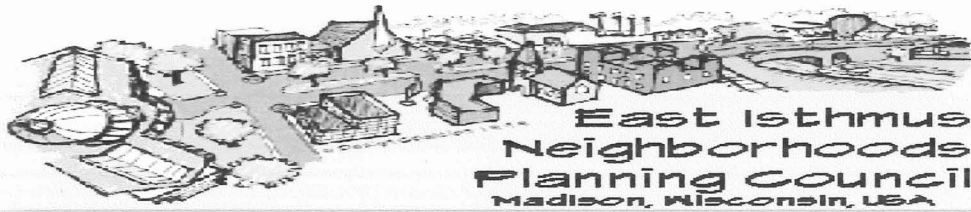

1. It makes sense to move ahead with option 5 quickly to see if the bacteria is causing some or all of the problem. The cost savings if the bacteria is a problem is significant.
2. Filtering seems to be the next obvious solution. However, the current well is located at a very popular sledding hill, right next to a very popular bike bath. Any new construction should not negatively impact either of these two uses.

Dear Water Utilities Board,

The East Isthmus Neighborhood Planning Council (EINPC) is a coalition of neighborhood associations, businesses and organizations within and surrounding Madison's East Isthmus.

We would like to applaud the Water Utility for their public participation efforts and have found the public meetings valuable to date. While we appreciate your response to the problems with Well 8, it is our belief that Well 8, being part of a larger system, must be considered together with that system and all applicable factors related to the Near East Side rather than as an isolated water source.

In as much as the wells are related, the solutions are also interrelated. For example, if we filter Well 8, we may not have to find a new well site to replace the former Well 3. Likewise, if we were to find a new well site, we might not have to run Well 8.

The EINPC encourages the Water Utilities Board and city staff to re-scope and redefine the Well 8 project into a Near East Side project that includes looking at the system as a whole.

Thank you for your time and attention to the East Side's water quality and accessibility. We look forward to hearing from you and would appreciate a written reply.

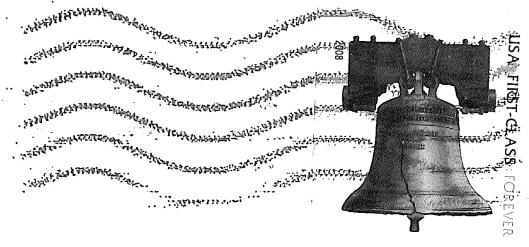

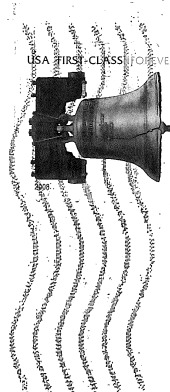
