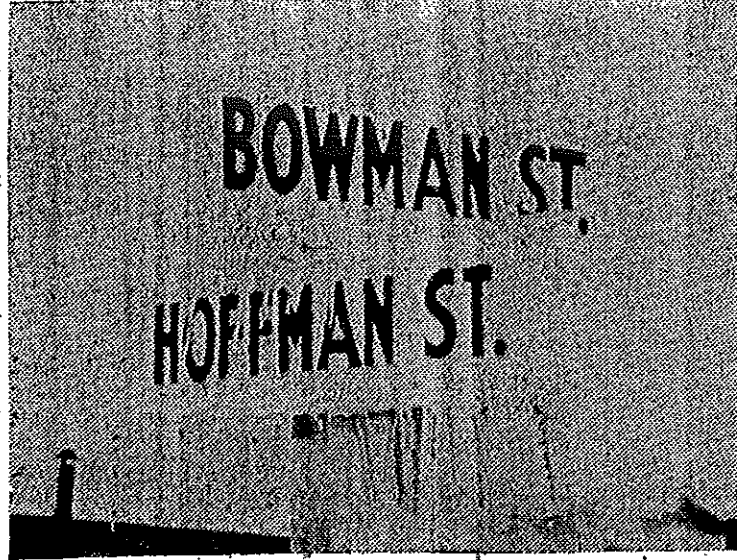


# Truax Streets Honor Men from State Who Gave Lives.

Madison air heroes honored at Truax Field by use of their names to designate streets of the post include Capt. John P. Bowman, son of Dr. and Mrs. F. F. Bowman, of Cottage Grove rd., and Capt. Sylvester A. Hoffman, son of Mr. and Mrs. Fred R. Hoffman, of 916 Van Buren st. Both men were killed in aerial combat duty in this war.

Natives of Wisconsin who have died while serving the army air forces (AAF) have been honored at Truax Field by having streets at that base renamed in their honor.

Of those streets already renamed, 26 are from Madison. The move is an outgrowth of an idea suggested by Brig. Gen. Vincent J. Meloy, post commander, and has been approved by AAF headquarters in Washington. Formerly the streets were numbered or alphabetized.

The last name of the dead person will designate the street, such as "Mitchell st.," after Gen. Billy Mitchell, a Wisconsin native.
