Authorizing the execution of a Declaration of Public Right of Way for an extension of Driscoll Drive through a portion of City-owned land generally addressed as 135 Rustic Drive. (District 3)

Amending the City of Madison Official Map to remove mapped reservations for future public streets located on Block 2 of the University Addition to Madison in the Northwest Quarter of Section 23, Township 7 North, Range 9 East in the City of Madison, on land generally addressed as 975 University Avenue. (District 8)

Public Hearings

Development-Related Requests

5. <u>89236</u>

139 W Wilson Street (District 4): Consideration of a conditional use in the UMX (Urban Mixed-Use) District for a new building with greater than six (6) stories, and consideration of a conditional use pursuant to MGO Section 28.134(3) for projections into the Capitol View Preservation Limit, to allow construction of a sixteen-story apartment building with 320 units.

On a motion by Solheim, seconded by Alder Field, the Commission voted to refer the item back to the November 17, 2025 Plan Commission meeting with direction to the applicant to submit the following materials and changes to submitted plans identified by the Commission needed for the proposal to meet conditional use standards 3 and 5:

- A management plan in the form required by the Zoning Administrator that additionally provides sufficient detail regarding issues identified by the Plan Commission necessary to address the concerns raised by the Commission regarding conditional use approval standards 3 and 5, including:
- resident move-in and move-out arrangements (including detailed information regarding the scheduling and area to be used for move in/move out operations),
 - management of vehicles parking in loading areas
 - short-term delivery and rideshare accommodations;
 - refuse pick-up (including scheduling), and
 - management and 24-hour contact.
- Minor revisions to the first floor to improve the loading area and accommodate a management office near the loading area and the front entry to the building.

The motion passed by voice vote/other

A motion was made by Solheim, seconded by Field, to Refer to the PLAN COMMISSION and should be returned by 11/17/2025. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

6. 90014

511-515 W Dayton Street (District 4): Consideration of a conditional use in the Downtown Residential 2 (DR2) District for a residential building complex containing two new (2) two-family dwellings in the rear yard of two existing three-family dwellings with shared pedestrian access.

On a motion by Alder Guequierre, seconded by Alder Glenn, the Commission found the standards met and approved the conditional use subject to the conditions recommended in the staff report with the following amendments to the recommended conditions of approval from UDC:

That condition of approval 3 be revised to read: "The project shall return to the UDC Secretary for final review and approval of UDC-recommended conditions of approval."

That condition of approval 5 be revised to read: "Add windows on the side elevation to break up the blank wall expanses."

The motion passed by voice vote/other.

Amending the City of Madison Official Map to remove a mapped reservation for a future public street located in the West Half of the Northwest Quarter of Section 31, Township 7 North, Range 10 East, in the City of Madison, on land addressed as 1201 Moorland Road (District 14).

On a motion by Alder Glenn, seconded by Solheim, the Commission recommended to Council to adopt the amendment to the official map. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

Creating Section 28.022-00729 of the Madison General Ordinances to change the zoning of property located at 1233-1241 Moorland Road from SR-C1 (Suburban Residential-Consistent 1) District to A (Agricultural) District. (District 14)
