As part of the motion to adopt the alternate, the following amendment (as recommended by the Board of Estimates at their 1/29/07 meeting) was referred to the Plan Commission:

The Director will create an ad hoc committee to explore creation of an Office of Neighborhood Support. This committee will be made up of neighborhood residents, neighborhood association members, planning council members, staff of the Planning Unit, CDBG, and OCS, alders and a representative of the Mayor's Office. The committee will consider the feasibility of using the new Planner 3 position to create a new staff position entitled "Neighborhood Support Officer," who will be the chief staff person to this office.

The Neighborhood Support Officer could serve as a clearinghouse for neighborhood requests, issues and services, and could implement many of the Neighborhood Staff Team draft recommendations, including the following: develop and track neighborhood early warning indicators; improve tracking of neighborhood plan recommendations; develop comprehensive, multi-agency responses to challenged neighborhoods; create and implement a neighborhood framework to improve the coordination and delivery of services to all neighborhoods; improve the coordination and strength of the Neighborhood Resource Teams; and synchronize grant programs.

The Neighborhood Support Officer will be physically located in the Planning Unit but report also to the Mayor in order to facilitate multi-agency cooperation in addressing neighborhood issues.

The ad hoc committee will be seated by May 1, 2007, with a report back date of September 4, 2007. Upon completion of the ad hoc committee's work, appropriate resolutions or ordinances will be forwarded to the City Council for approval.
