The concerns include the erosion of the historic district, removing a landmark building when the proposed use of the site is unknown and the stewardship of historic buildings owned/managed by Apex.

Mr. Mohs explained that the Steering Committee has been cooperative with the Bethel development team and have allowed the Bethel team to investigate the option to move the landmark. The Steering Committee has not agreed to moving the house.
