

RE PDQ;

Alder David Ahrens District 15 is not representing the members of our small quiet neighborhood. If he had been expressing our neighborhood's wishes he would not be helping to push this project forward. I live two blocks from the proposed PDQ.

If 15 percent of the traffic end up traveling the back roads, "OUR NEIGHBORHOOD" it could mean 12,000 additional cars and trucks per month. That is an extra 12,000 vehicles endangering the neighborhood children.

If any children or neighbors in our quiet neighborhood are injured by increased traffic on side streets or attempting to cross East Wash because this project is allowed to go forward against the wishes of the Neighborhood I will be sure to include every member's name that approves this plan in an editorial to the media that will include this letter and my recommendations to include those responsible for endangering our neighborhood children in any resulting legal action.

If a minimum 15 percent of the traffic end up wanting to go East on East Washington that will be another 12,000 per month people trying to take a left onto East Wash. I have been struggling with that intersection for 20 years. Now myself and my neighbors and I will be competing with another 12,000-40,000 cars per month to make a left at that intersection?

Under no circumstances should the city allow this project to impact our QUIET NEIGHBORHOOD.

No way should there be any project of high volume traffic with access to Schmedeman Ave. This would endanger our neighborhood children and greatly inconvenience others in OUR NEIGHBORHOOD.

I have to Work until 6 PM, so I doubt that I will get an opportunity to express other concerns. What I have already pointed out in this brief note should make this project a no brainer no go if anyone is really concerned about our QUIET neighborhood.

Absolutely no way should any plan include access to Schmedeman Ave.

Please respect the wishes of our neighborhood and stand up for us since our new Alder does not value our wishes. Unfortunately I have to ask, why he is more concerned about pushing this project through than representing the wishes of my neighbors and myself.
