RESOLUTION

Whereas, the process of transferring participant's Section 8 rent assistance between jurisdictions, (referred to as "porting") occurs routinely between the CDA and the Dane County Housing Authority,(DCHA) but this process is sometimes a burden for households with disabled family members; and

Whereas, On August 1, 1979 the CDA adopted Resolution #20 permitting DCHA to administer Section 8 assistance for up to 20 families with disabilities inside the jurisdiction of the CDA recognizing that more agencies serving the disabled and more units with accessibility features might be available within the City; and

Whereas, On June 25, 1981, the CDA approved Resolution #249, expanding the number of slots from 20 to 35 for such Section 8 families with an understanding that either housing authority could dissolve the agreement based upon annual review; and

Whereas, On April 14, 1988, the CDA approved Resolution #1084, making the arrangement reciprocal in that up to 35 disabled households with CDA vouchers could also select a unit outside the City in communities contiguous with the City but in the jurisdiction of DCHA; and

Whereas, the number of slots available to each housing authority has been sufficient until recently when the DCHA reached 35 vouchers inside the City and CDA has reached 27 vouchers in the County,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the CDA agrees to amend this inter-jurisdictional arrangement to increase the number of slots for each housing authority to 40 households.
