At the last CCOC meeting (March 4, 2008) members requested that I find out more about the recruitment process for the city's AASPIRE Internship program. The following is an email I received from Harper Donahue from the Affirmative Action Division (Civil Rights Recruitments Specialist). 1. How the recruitment process is conducted?

- "The City of Madison's AASPIRE program is an Affirmative Action initiative designed to provide college students professional work experience and mentoring opportunities in city government. This program AASPIRE (Affirmative Action Student Professionals in Residence) is designed to typically provide 8-9 weeks of full-time internship for a select number of college students interested in pursuing a professional career in the public service."
- This year's recruitment period began March 3rd and will close March 28th. Interested applicants are required to submit a formal City application along with a resume and a letter of interest.
- Shortly after the recruitment period ends I, along with HR, will review the the application materials and make referrals to participating Departments/Divisions. Participating Departments/Divisions are required to offer an interview to all certified individuals (typically 6-9 candidates).
- The anticipated start date for 2008 AASPIRE Interns is May19th.
- 2. Who is targeted during the recruitment process?
 - While ANY college student is eligible to participate in the AASPIRE Program, the focus of the recruitment targets Affirmative Action Target Group Members.
