

Dane County Households 2000 and 2010 Census












Dane County Population by Ethnicity/Race





Dane County Population by Age Group and Ethnicity/Race (2012)







Educational Attainment—Dane County population 25 years and over (2012)








Civilian Population in Dane County and the Labor Force Ages 25 to 54 years (2010 to 2012 averages)







Per capita income in the past 12 months by Ethnicity/Race (in 2012 inflation-adjusted dollars)









Individuals Below the Poverty Level by Ethnicity/Race (2012)



Percent of Individuals Below the Poverty Level by Ethnicity/Race for Dane County, Wisconsin and the United States (2012)




Families Below the Poverty Level by Marital Status (2012)





Marital Status of Women Giving Birth and the Poverty Level (2012)




Families Below the Poverty Level by Ethnicity and Marital Status (2012)



Poverty Status in the Past 12 Months by Ethnicity, Sex and Age (2012)




Individuals below and above the Poverty Level by Place of Birth (2012)
