Mifflin St Resident Meeting

October 11, 2007 EVP Coffee

- City Neighborhood Traffic Management Program
 - "Grassroots" program initiated by citizens
 - Uses physical devices to slow traffic
- Mifflin enrolled in 2003
- Next step-show staff that there is modicum of support usually via petition

- Next Step
 - City collect speed, volume, crash data, environmental factors and rank street
 - ~\$200,000 is provided by the Council/Year
 - Required to prioritize citizen requests
- Initial Mifflin data and rank 2003
 - 1010 ADT
 - 28 mph 85 percentile speed
 - 37.5 total points secured-sufficient to be funded

Next Step

- City administered survey
 - Used to determine if there is support to send a project to the Council for consideration. Council always makes the determination if a project proceeds.
 - The area that is surveyed is intended to involve the residents on the project street as they have the greatest say in the matter
 - One survey per household is tallied
 - Property owners and renters are all included in the survey process

- Survey Stage
 - Results required to proceed
 - Sixty percent of surveys returned must be in favor for a project to proceed to the Council.
 - Mifflin Results
 - 93 Surveys were mailed to residents
 - 41 Surveys were returned-response rate of 44%
 - 28 Surveys in favor or 68%
 - 13 Surveys in opposition 32%

- Controversy
 - First--we put the contractor on hold
 - Questions as to how we got to this point
 - 'Was only needed due to E Wash. Recon.'
 - Concerns that some survey signatures were not collected thru the US Mail

- Response
 - Contractor on hold
 - Collected new speed and volume data to see if Mifflin would still rank now that this part of E Wash recon is over

Re-ranked

- Question was asked "do we still meet the necessary points to participate?" Yes
- Points went from 37.5 to 34.9, still sufficient to participate in the program
