RESOLUTION

Whereas, the CDA Board of Commissioners adopted the following language under New Activities in the CDA Annual Plan for 2018 submitted to HUD, "The CDA is considering adopting a "moving up" option within its Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) program, which would provide HCV assistance to a limited number of families who reside in Permanent Supportive Housing. As allowed by HUD, a Public Housing Authority (PHA) may have a preference for individuals and families transitioning, or "moving up," from Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) units, which HUD defines as persons that were previously homeless prior to entry into the PSH program, but who no longer need that level of supportive services. While these persons would not be considered homeless for reporting purposes to HUD, creating such a "move up" preference will contribute significantly to the community's overall efforts to end homelessness by freeing up units for currently homeless families and individuals with disabilities who need housing combined with services."

And Whereas, the City of Madison has contracted with The Road Home to provide case management to support families that will be referred from Permanent Supportive Housing to receive rent assistance through the CDA Housing Choice Voucher program,

Therefore, be it hereby resolved, that the CDA Board of Commissioners authorizes the Community Development Authority to implement a "Moving Up" preference in the Section 8 Voucher program to provide rental assistance to families in Permanent Supportive Housing.
