And if you're getting the windows custom made, then you can make a statement that the window component dimensions will be fabricated to match the original exactly.

Hi Heather,

Thanks for speaking with Raj this morning about our application. I've been in touch with our contractor and he is going to re-do the bid to eliminate the aluminum cladding. For the external frames that are too rotted to repair (and there are definitely at least 5 of those, I would think?) he is proposing to replace the frames in the same style using cedar. Is that something that sounds workable? Do you need more detail about what it would look like?

Then, sorry for this, but could you explain again what sash measurements you need? Is it, for each window, the measurements of the wood that frames the glass? I don't think I can get the measurements for the new windows because we, of course, have not yet ordered them, and they will be custom made. But I can definitely do that for our existing windows.
