Amending Section 33.02(2) of the Madison General Ordinances to modify the composition of the Alcohol License Review Committee.

DRAFTER'S ANALYSIS: This substitute ordinance adds an alder and an adult resident to the Alcohol License Review Committee. The Committee will then consist of 9 members: 3 alders and 6 adult citizens, one of which shall be a student at UW-Madison, MATC or Edgewood. Term of service is revised from two years to three years, except that the student appointee is a 2-year term. The effective date of this ordinance shall be January 1, 2010.

The Common Council of the City of Madison do hereby ordain as follows:

1. Subsection (2) entitled "Composition" of Section 33.02 entitled "Alcohol License Review Committee is amended to read as follows:

- "(2) <u>Composition</u>.
  - (a) The Alcohol License Review Committee shall consist of <u>sevennine</u> (79) members, <u>twothree</u> (23) of whom shall be alderpersons and <u>fivesix</u> (56) who shall be adult residents of the City. The President of the Dane County Tavern League, the Chief of Police, the <u>chair of the Student Council of the Associated Students of Madison</u>, and the University of Wisconsin Chancellor, or their designees, shall serve as technical advisors to the Committee. The position of chair of the Student Council of the Associated Students of Madison technical advisor shall expire three (3) years from the date of enactment. The City Clerk, the City Attorney, or their designees, and the city of Madison Alcohol Policy Coordinator (or other Mayoral designee) shall serve as staff to the Committee. Technical advisors to the Committee, upon proper recognition by the Chair, may question witnesses who appear before the Committee and may take part in debate, but shall not have a vote and shall not take part in any deliberations held in closed session.
  - (b) All aldermanic appointees shall hold office for a term expiring on the third Tuesday in April in the second year following their appointment or until their successors are appointed and qualified, except that alderpersons appointed to fill an unexpired term shall only serve the remainder of such unexpired term. Resident appointments shall be made by the third Tuesday in April and such appointees shall hold office for a term expiring on the third Tuesday in April in the second year following their confirmation by the Common Council or until their successors are appointed and qualified, except that residents appointed to fill an unexpired term shall only serve the remainder of such unexpired term. Resident appointments, other than the student appointment, shall all be for a term of twothree years.
  - (c) One of the adult resident appointments shall be a student, at least 18 years of age, enrolled at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, Madison Area Technical College or Edgewood College. The term of the student appointment shall be two (2) years. The student governments of each university or college may submit nominations to the Mayor, and any other student may apply for appointment. The Mayoral student appointment is, like other adult resident appointments, subject to confirmation by the Common Council."

2. This ordinance shall be effective January 1, 2010, and the Mayor may submit appointments to the Common Council to be effective as of that date.
