854 East Washington Avenue - Demolition and Construction of a Temporary Parking Lot in Urban Design District No. 4. 2nd Ald. Dist.

The motion recommended to the Plan Commission, that any request for extended use after the initial 3-year period of the operation of the temporary parking use not be extended without a parking reduction in combination with the minimization of impervious area (pavement) and additional landscaping to return for Urban Design Commission review and approval. In addition, the landscape element at the corner of Paterson Street and East Washington Avenue shall be modified to redistribute landscape plantings internally and to provide for more pervious pavement within the parking display area.

4801 Tradewinds Parkway - Main Tenant Wall Signage for a Multi-Tenant Office/Production Facility in Urban Design District No. 1. 16th Ald. Dist.

The motion for final approval required the overall wall graphics letters shall be located beneath and between the ends of the two upper window openings with the letters raised from the face by a minimum of 1  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch standoff at an overall letter height of 2 feet. The other main tenant sign, when developed, shall meet the same criteria.

611 Langdon Street - PUD(GDP-SIP), New Hillel Building. 8th Ald. Dist.

The motion required the applicant to provide various options for staff approval to address the safety issues associated with the stadium seating area's design, its proximity to the main stairway, and entry to the building and make stairway continuous off of the northwesterly corner of the building form grade with adjustments to the granite blocks feature.
