Roll Call

Public Comment

There was no public comment.

Approval of Minutes

A motion was made by Better, seconded by Onken, to Approve the Minutes of August 29, 2006. The motion passed by acclamation.

Discussion Items

- [05157](#)** Review of General Election

Ms. Witzel-Behl reported that she estimated there were 25,000 Election Day Registrations in Madison on November 7. The City Clerk's Office has finished processing about 9,000 of those registration forms.

Ms. Witzel-Behl said the election went well with a lot of interagency support, including an unprecedented level of support from the Mayor's Office. She said the problems were a bomb threat at East High School, complaints about lighting at Elver Park, and the need to rearrange the set-up at Fire Station #1.
- [05158](#)** Preparation for Spring Primary and Spring Election

The April 3, 2007, Spring Election will take place during the UW-Madison Spring Break and the Madison Metropolitan School District Spring Break. The City Clerk's Office will work with the University of Wisconsin - Madison on an absentee drive for UW students.
- [05156](#)** Review of City Clerk office budget

Committee members looked at the City Clerk's Office budget for 2007. The Clerk reported that the Mayor and Common Council approved the department's budget request.

Discussion Items

4. [05141](#) Establishment of additional polling places

Mr. Malischke suggested that the wards voting at Kennedy Elementary, Elvehjem Elementary, High Point Church, and Heritage Congregational Church be split into separate polling places. He said this should have been done three years ago, and he would like to see it take place in 2007.

Mr. Onken said the appropriate time to request this funding would be in the City Clerk's Office budget request for 2008.

Mr. Malischke said he would like this item placed on the January MEAC agenda.

Mr. Malischke suggested that this item be placed on the next agenda. Ms. Deutch said this item would go hand in hand with the recruitment and training of poll workers. Ms. Deutch requested that Ms. Witzel-Behl provide committee members with a written description of how she communicates with poll workers.

Mr. Onken said this discussion has occurred in the past, and that the City Attorney would need to verify whether anyone who is part of the official process needs to be paid. He suggested that, if the City Attorney says that they can volunteer, the private sector could be encouraged to participate in the election process.

Ms. Deutch told committee members that the United Way can list poll worker positions as volunteer opportunities on their website, in the Isthmus, and in their business volunteer network. She said the Madison Advertising Federation, local advertising agencies, and the UW School of Business might provide additional assistance. Ms. Deutch suggested that this be an agenda item for the January MEAC meeting.
