

C. Narrative

My design envisions Madison before concrete and buildings—an homage to the land's natural history and the Native people who lived in balance with it. Focused on native plant life, the design bridges past and present, inviting viewers to see the beauty and ecological value of species often overlooked. If we connect, we care.

The foreground highlights native plants rendered with enough realism to convey the specific beauty of each species, reflecting my love of brilliant color and botanical detail. In contrast, the background is more graphic and bold, moving symbolically through the seasons: a prairie fire renews an oak savanna in spring, followed by abstracted summer greens, wild rice along the marsh, and the changing hues of fall. Distant ridges anchor the composition, referencing land that once held more than 1,500 sacred Native American effigy mounds.

My research was rooted in collaboration and exploration. I consulted a UW professor of landscape history, volunteered with a greenway restoration group, and spoke with Madison's Stormwater Vegetation Coordinator. I visited the Arboretum, Olbrich Gardens, Aldo Leopold Center, and parks across Dane County. I reached out to the Ho-Chunk Tribal Historic Preservation Officer to approach this work with cultural respect. I also gathered stories, imagery, and insight from books, scholarly articles, and community voices—far more than could fit in one mural.

To extend the mural's impact, I would like to incorporate a QR code that links to curated information and resources on native plants, restoration efforts, and the land's layered history.
