It was explained that City Engineering does projects and assesses adjacent property owners in conjunction with assessment policy and ordinances. This is applied uniformly. City believes they cannot make exceptions – state law/policy states that you cannot single an entity out for special treatment.

MMSD provided a memo on a list of the amount of money the district pays the city. There was discussion on a number of projects that each party pays for out of their budget.

Action: The city will provide a list of the costs that are paid to MMSD. There was no resolution. The discussion focused on a better understanding of the beliefs of both groups.
