Hi Alder Ellingson,

Attached is a draft final marking and signing plan. I will make copies for your council mailbox. Dan Dettmann, our signal engineer, will be at the BPW to discuss and he will have copies as well. You may know Dan lives in that area so he knows the intersection very well, and he is probably the best traffic signal engineer in the state, in my opinion.

The plans for the project are to improve the ped-bike conditions as much as possible in a cost effective and timely manner. The street is all concrete so redoing the curb results in major work of replacing the entire 11-ft wide lane and more. It is not like asphalt where easier changes can be made. One area we do want to add more is the pork chop island itself and make the ped ramps double-wide with a wider 12 ft-plus wide crosswalk marking--to support and add more capacity for both peds and bikes. The latest plans from City Engineering has the ramps as a standard single wide version but they said they are willing to work with us making the ramps wider. Some of those are details but they are important for the pedestrians and bicyclists and residents who use the street and crossings. If we do the double-wide ramps in conjunction with the new traffic signals for the right turn lane (first application of a right turn lane in the State), along with new bike lane (sharrow) markings for the right turn lane from Haywood, I think we have accomplished a solid, positive project.

In the future, with possibly more concrete work and the potential undergrounding of the power lines we should be able to accomplish more and make a bigger difference. I would encourage this to you and the BPW as a needed and positive project to support.

We appreciate being able to do this project and City Engineering deserves a huge point of credit for lending that support.
