

ABSTRACT

A successful work of public art acts as a frame. It allows one to see the entirety of a site, the architecture, and community with fresh eyes. This act of renewed seeing is the point of departure for my proposed installation: *Luminous Flux*.

Luminous Flux makes use of the multiple viewpoints and contextual variations of the Rotary Centennial Plaza area. The sculpture provides a rich and layered conceptual experience in a simple iconic form intended to draw visitors to this important corner of Madison's cultural landscape.

THE SCULPTURE

In its simplest interpretation, *Luminous Flux* is a light fixture. It is composed of a cluster of streetlights in keeping with familiar local lighting features. Here, however, the lights come to life. Rising from a single foundation, the light poles gradually diverge into individual intertwining paths – abandoning a static vertical posture to join together into a vibrant and life-like form.

Suggesting a tree, a swarm, or a choreographed dance, *Luminous Flux* literally illuminates, but also suggest that the ordinary can become extraordinary, and in fact that the ordinary itself *is* extraordinary.

VARIATIONS

Night will provide an entirely unique experience of *Luminous Flux*. Each fixture will emit a subtle glow creating a vibrant play of light throughout the sculpture and surrounding architecture. *Luminous Flux* will both illuminate and create a visual anchor for this corner of Capital Square.

The unique winter conditions of the site have also been taken into consideration. With snow on the ground, the reflective aluminum surface of *Luminous Flux* will glow with a fantastical effect.


VIEWPOINTS

Luminous Flux can be seen from many viewpoints throughout the Capital Square area. Each provides a unique experience:

- From the center of the square, on the Capitol building side, the sculpture will draw the eye to the plaza reflecting the form of the trees that line adjacent streets.
- From North Pinckney and East Mifflin Streets the sculpture's dynamic natural form will be profiled against the orderly lines of the surrounding architecture creating an exciting visual contrast.
- From North Hamilton, the work will stand against the impressive backdrop of the State Capitol Building and its surrounding landscape visually lying between the State Capital Building's classical style light poles and the surrounding trees.
- Throughout the Children's Museum, multiple views of the work will come into view providing glimpses of the whole.




Light fixtures are efficient *Phillips lifeLED* fixtures and will be dimmed to specification. The entire sculpture will require approx 250 watts - about half the energy required for one standard street light fixture. On and off functions will be controlled by a photo sensitive switch.

Maintenance


The work will be virtually maintenance free. Bulb replacement (estimates every 20 years) and maintenance will be identical to surrounding light fixtures and can be integrated into the city's regular maintenance schedule.




TOTAL DIMENSIONS




COMPONENT DIMENSIONS
