SUMMARY:

Tim Heggland, consultant for West Side Architectural Survey, briefly presented the findings. Mr. Heggland explained that the purpose of an architectural survey is two-fold:

- To identify properties in the survey area that are eligible for the National Register of Historic Places which has implications for the City; and
- To create a database of locations of historic resources for city, state, and local agencies.

The National Register is looking for buildings that are 50 years old with an intact appearance.

Mr. Heggland described the boundaries of the survey area. Mr. Heggland provided a slide show of a few of the individual buildings found to be eligible and showed maps of five potential historic districts.
