2. 65686 Welcome-Mayor Satya Rhodes-Conway

Mayor Satya Rhodes-Conway – Mayor Spoke about the history of Guaranteed Income programs nationally, and introduced Mayor Michael Tubbs from Stockton, Calif. - the founder of Mayors for a Guaranteed Income.

Mayors for a Guaranteed Income Founder, Michael Tubbs. Former Mayor Tubbs made remarks regarding his personal childhood experience and struggles along with lessons learned from the Stockton program as well as the positive impact it had on families mentally, physically, and socially. Madison is one of around 50 cities now involved in National pilot, and one of the first 15 to become a member city. In Stockton the program allowed people to weather a financial emergency.

Mayor Tubbs and MGI Dep Dir. Cameron Burns were able to answer some questions from task force members.

 Q: Former Alder Shiva – as we embark and make granular decisions in this work in Madison are there any tidbits or lessons learned as you implemented work?

A: Former Mayor Tubbs - our trust of government is low, honest

communication/outreach is necessary. People need to have access to someone. Program must stay true to its word, it important to do what you say i.e. if it going to be a specific number of people, keep it at that number; if is to be received a specific day make sure money is received in that particular day.

• Q: Sabrina Madison - wanted to know of ways to connect and engage people who would benefit from the program.

A: Former Mayor Tubbs spoke of having them be part of making decisions. Stockton had participants sit at the Leadership Table. That was a place where qualitative data was gathered. Cameron Burns – People who benefit from the program were part from the beginning.

Mayor gave background on decisions made to-date. One piece that is important on the way Stockton did their program was setting up randomized control trial. Because of how they set up the Stockton SEED Program, at the end of their trial they could make inferences and say things like: "People who received the GI were more likely to have full time employment than those that did not; and people received GI reported better mental health, than those that did not." They were able to say that with certainty and have the data to back it up. We will be working with UPenn Center for a Guaranteed Income Research and incorporate their research design into Madison program.

UPenn asked for at least 100, and we have at least 125 thanks to donors; need a control group of closer to 200 or more families; families will receive \$500 a month for a year. The survey design will be based on the UPenn design. The task force will need to look at Madison-specific questions.

In order for Madison to get to 325 + families, eligibility for the program needs to stay relatively broad. The current thinking eligibility will be based on families with kids in the home, up to 18yrs, with income at or below 200% FPL.

One of the requirements from Mayor's for Guaranteed Income is to have a fiscal agent outside of the City of Madison. The Give Back Foundation are donating their service.

Disbursement partner is TASC – Taylor Stinchfield is the staff at TASC to contact. TASC will distribute benefit cards (like a debit card) to participants and reload every month.

Research Partner is Institute for Research on Poverty at UW - Hillary Shager
