SUBJECT: **2015 Third Quarter Traffic Enforcement Activity Report**

The information provided in this document represents the Madison Police Department's traffic enforcement and safety activity for the third quarter of 2015.

It is the goal of the Madison Police Department to make our streets safer for all users. We feel that our streets should be safely shared by motorists, bicyclists and pedestrians.

Traffic Citations

The Madison Police Department issued **6,946** traffic citations (**4,401** citations were for hazardous violations and **2,545** citations were for non-hazardous violations) in the 3rd quarter of 2015. These numbers reflect a decrease over the total number of citations (**8,818**) issued in the 3rd quarter of 2014, but more than the **5,234** citations that the Madison Police Department issued for the 3rd quarter of 2013.

T.E.S.T. (Traffic Enforcement Safety Team)

Of the **6,946** total citations issued in the 3rd quarter, **3,014** citations (**1,762** hazardous and **1,252** non-hazardous), were issued by the Traffic Enforcement Safety Team. They also issued (**1,454**) written warnings. These numbers represent an increase from the total number of citations (**2,649**) issued by TEST officers during the 3rd quarter of 2014 and (**2,211**) citations in the 3rd quarter of 2013.

In addition to their normal traffic enforcement duties, the TEST officers participated in several community events including the following: MMSD Pilot GDL driving program for teens, Safe Harbor Ride, Elver Park fireworks, Warner Park fireworks, Camp Hero, Cops Kids Ride, Badger Motor Officers Association Advanced Training, Latino Youth Academy, and the DOT Ford Driving School.

Speeding

2015 3rd quarter citations for speeding totaled **2,518**. This is a slight decrease compared with the **2,837** citations issued in the 3rd quarter of 2014, but an increase from the **1,372** citations issued in the 3rd quarter of 2013.

Red Signal Violations

During 3rd quarter 2015, **194** red signal violation citations were issued. **156** red signal violations were written during 3rd quarter of 2014.

Traffic Complaint Hotline (266-4822)

The Traffic Complaint Hotline received **138** citizen calls during the 3rd quarter of 2015. **82** warning letters were sent as a result of reported violations. This compares with **259** complaints and **103** letters during the 3rd quarter of 2014.

School Zones

School zones violation reports from Crossing Guards resulted in **60** warning letters being sent and **62** citations issued for observed violations in the 3rd quarter of 2015.

Traffic Enforcement/Safety Grants

(18) Alcohol Enforcement, **(18)** Speed Enforcement, **(14)** Pedestrian Safety and **(3)** Bicycle Safety overtime grant initiatives were scheduled for the 3rd quarter of 2015. These were coordinated through the Department of Transportation, Bureau of Transportation Safety. The grant initiatives focused on Impaired Driving (OMVWI), Speeding, Pedestrian Safety and Bicycle safety. These **53** grant initiatives resulted in **1,336** citations and **375** warnings.

2015 Fatal Crashes

1. 03/13/15
800 N. Stoughton Rd
MV/FO – a motor vehicle at high speeds lost control and struck a fixed object, killing the driver of the vehicle.
2. 03/28/15
N. Stoughton Rd at E. Washington Av
MV/CMV – a motor vehicle drove into the back of a semi that was stopped for a red signal at E. Washington Av. The driver of the motor vehicle died as a result of the injuries sustained in the collision.
3. 04/13/15
400 Commerce Dr.
MV/Off Roadway – A driver had a medical event and died, causing the vehicle to drive off the roadway into a ditch.
4. 05/14/15
5800 Femrite Dr.
MV/FO – a motor vehicle rammed into a bridge abutment at high speeds with the operator not restrained in the vehicle.
5. 06/10/15
8000 Raymond Rd
MV/Bicycle – a bicyclist traveling south on a bike path entered into the roadway as a motor vehicle was approaching westbound. The motor vehicle was unable to avoid the bicyclist, who died as a result of the injuries sustained in the collision.
6. 06/18/15
N. Stoughton Rd at E Washington Av
MV/Ped – a motor vehicle operator increased speed and intentionally ran over a pedestrian in the marked crosswalk. Operator has been charged with 1st degree intentional homicide.
7. 07/13/15
University Av at Ridge St
MV/Bicycle – a bicyclist traveling north on Ridge St entered onto University Av against the traffic light. The motor vehicle operator was unable to avoid the bicyclist, who died as a result of the injuries sustained in the collision.
8. 09/05/15
Nakoosa Rd
MV/Ped – a motor vehicle operator lost control of his vehicle and drove up onto a sidewalk, striking and killing a pedestrian. The driver has been charged with OWI Homicide.
