Reason For Request

RENEW Wisconsin is a nonprofit organization that promotes renewable energy in Wisconsin. They work on policies and programs that expand solar power, wind power, biogas, local hydropower, geothermal energy, and electric vehicles. Since 1991, they have been a champion for clean energy solutions in the Badger State. RENEW Wisconsin has partnered with the City of Madison since 2016 to administer the MadiSUN program. Since 2016, the MadiSUN program has supported the installation of more than 3 MW of solar in Madison through various programs, including helping nearly 300 households to install over 1,500 kilowatts of solar energy, generating over \$4.2 million in local clean energy investments. An additional 19 community organizations, affordable housing providers, and businesses have installed approximately 1,056 kilowatts of solar energy, generating another \$2.7 million in local clean energy

investments.

RENEW Wisconsin has been a valuable partner in not only increasing solar adoption in the City of Madison, but also streamlining the solar adoption process to make it easier for Madisonians to install solar on their homes and businesses, providing solar education throughout the community, and supporting equitable, green workforce development. The MadiSUN program is integral in its contribution towards the City's 100% Renewable Energy goal, and RENEW has the unique expertise and experience to continue administering this successful program.
