Attorney Zilavy reported that a pre-trial has been set for the following charges against Simm's Place (2231 Myrtle Street): no licensed bartender on duty; three counts of permitting underage on premise, four counts of selling to underage; and four counts of failure to enforce the no smoking ordinance. She said there could be an assessment of 350 points for these violations, and that would result in a license suspension.

<u>02471</u> Standards for Granting Operator's Licenses

A motion was made by Rearick, seconded by Ald. Olson, to Take Off The Table. The motion passed by acclamation.

Mr. Kamp referred to the notice on the operator license application that says, "A false answer and/or omission of any information requested on this form may result in an unfavorable recommendation or denial. He said the committee needs to define "falsify" because applicants who omit convictions tell the committee that they were just being vague. Mr. Hart said something needs to be done to ensure applicants understand that they are obligated to write everything down.

Attorney Zilavy told committee members that denying operator licenses in cases where the application has been falsified would actually help the applicants because they would pay the consequence and would not falsify future applications.

Captain Lengfeld said the Police Department is looking for honesty when it runs background checks on these applications and decides whether applicants will be asked to appear before the Alcohol License Review Committee.

Ms. Rearick said the applications before the committee at this meeting made it obvious that testimony and applications are interpreted by committee members in a lot of different ways.

Mr. Plant said job, age, and attitude should not matter in these considerations, and that the committee needs to find some kind of consistency.

Mr. McNamara said it is the committee's job to consider the human condition. He said the application form creates a gray area by saying the applicant may be called before the committee and falsified applications may result in denial.

Captain Lengfeld said the committee has to be consistent in dealing with a public license, or applicants who are denied will claim prejudice.

Mr. Hart said the language on the application form creates a two-prong test: whether the applicant meets the minimum requirements set forth in the application, and the human element. He said he will always vote to reject applications with intentional material omissions.

Mr. Plant said he has observed that there is no consistency, and that general statements will slide by when applicants are called before the committee.

Ms. Wheaton asked why incomplete applications cannot be sent back to the applicants without requesting their appearance before the committee. Captain Lengfeld responded that the applicants still have the right to defend themselves before the committee.

Ms. Rearick said committee members were not going to get anywhere on this issue because they have different ideas of what "incomplete" means.

Mr. Billups said the Police Department can bypass the committee because they obviously do that for the majority of operator license applications that go straight to the Common Council agenda.

Alderperson Olson suggested revising the operator license application form. Mr. Plant said he would present a draft to the committee at its February 15, 2006, meeting.
