SUMMARY:

At its meeting of July 11, 2007, the Urban Design Commission **GRANTED FINAL APPROVAL** of a public building located at 919 East Main Street. Appearing on behalf of the project were Brian Reddeman and Richard C. Lundeen. The modified plans as presented featured the following:

- Contextual information as to the location of the site as it relates to the adjacent "Big Blue" building and its intersection at Patterson and East Main Streets was provided.
- The site/landscape plan featured the pulling of the fence line back to match the setback of the "big blue building" with the incorporation of an ornamental black fence along the street side with close links and epoxy coating to reduce tagging in combination with proposed landscaping.
- The phases of development were further defined to provide for the creation of the storage building and yard as part of Phase 1 with future consideration for the current paint shop areas of Phase 2.
- A review of the lighting plan noted that fully cut-off fixtures will be provided between overhead doors on the building.

ACTION:

On a motion by Barnett, seconded by Barrett, the Urban Design Commission **GRANTED FINAL APPROVAL**. The motion was passed on a unanimous vote of (7-0). The motion for final approval was for Phase 1 only with the requirement that the fence post be set into the landscaped area at the street.
