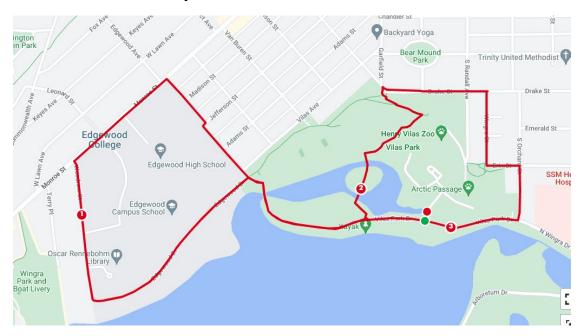

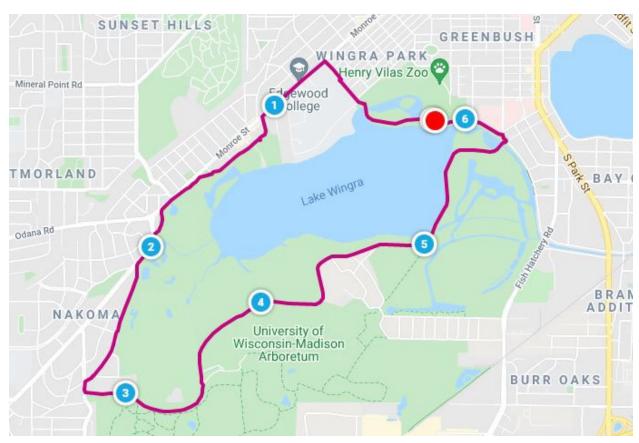

Run Wild – Sunday, September 24th, 2023 Race Day Volunteer Instructions

I. Welcome

Thank you for volunteering to help with the Henry Vilas Zoo Run Wild! This is a huge event with hundreds of runners, and we couldn't do it without the help of our volunteers. Thank you for waking up early for our animals and our community. ©

II. Race Day Volunteer Check-In

All volunteers must check in. There are two times you can check in before your volunteer shift:

- Saturday, September 27th, 8:30AM-1:30PM, Henry Vilas Zoo Volunteer Central (see map)
- Sunday, September 25th, 5:30AM-12:30PM, Henry Vilas Zoo Volunteer Central (see map)

We highly encourage everyone volunteering on race day to check in the Saturday before. We anticipate parking and general navigating to be much more difficult on Sunday morning when runners begin to arrive. Volunteers who check in on Saturday can go straight to their stations Sunday morning and text/call the Volunteer Coordinator upon arrival (#608-520-0027).

If you absolutely have to check in on Sunday morning, there are a few things you can do to make things easier:

- Come earlier than your shift especially if you're driving. If parking, do not park in the zoo lots, as there will be runners and we don't want you getting stuck after your shift.
- If you are volunteering with a group, you send one representative to check in for everyone.

Once you check-in, you'll be given your t-shirt and specific role instructions for the day, as well as emergency and check-out procedures.

III. Getting Here

We highly suggest all volunteers walk, bike or take public transportation to the zoo. We have bike racks outside both entrances. No bus comes directly to the zoo; however, Routes 4, 5 & 7 will all get you closest with the smallest amount of walking. (See Madison Metro Transit's website for bus route information: https://www.cityofmadison.com/metro/routes-schedules).

IV. Parking

If you have to park on race day, your best bet is to plan ahead and look at the city parking map: https://www.cityofmadison.com/parking-utility/street-parking/unmetered-street-areas

Most areas are 2-3hr parking; however, there are some streets with free parking in the neighborhoods around the zoo.

Please don't plan to park in the Henry Vilas Zoo lots, as they will fill up fast and might be blocked in by runners later in the morning.

V. Dress

All volunteers will receive an event volunteer t-shirt. However, it's forecasted to be around the low 50's for race day morning (highs in 70's). So please be prepared and dress in layers.

EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN (EAP)

I. GENERAL

The "Run Wild" will be held September 24, 2023 at Henry Vilas Zoo, and surrounding streets.

II. PURPOSE

- A. This emergency action plan predetermines actions to take before and during the "Run Wild 2021" (hereinafter referred to as the event) in response to an emergency or otherwise hazardous condition. These actions will be taken by organizers, management, personnel, and attendees. These actions represent those required prior to the event in preparation for and those required during an emergency.
- B. Flexibility must be exercised when implementing this plan because of the wide variety of potential hazards that exist for this event. These hazards include, but are not limited to, Fire, Medical Emergencies, Severe Weather, or situations where Law Enforcement is required.

III. ASSUMPTIONS

The possibility of an occurrence of an emergency is present at this event. The types of emergencies possible are various and could require the response of Fire & Rescue, Emergency Medical Services, and Police.

IV. BASIC PLAN

A. Emergency Action Plan (EAP) Event Representative

1. The EAP event representative will be identified as the point of contact for all communications regarding the event. This person is identified as Conservation Education Curator: Jess Thompson.

B. Emergency Notification

1.	In the event of an emergency, notification of the emergency will be through the use of 911. The
	caller should have the following information available to the 911 operator: nature of emergency,
	location, and contact person with callback number.

C. Severe Weather

- 1. Weather forecasts and current conditions can be monitored through the <u>National Weather</u> Service's Madison Weather Forecast website.
- 2. Before the event If severe weather is predicted prior to the event, the EAP event representative will evaluate the conditions and determine if the event will remain scheduled. The EAP event representative or his/her designee will be identified as such Jess Thompson and will be responsible to monitor the weather conditions before and during the event.
- 3. During the event If severe weather occurs during the event, the EAP event representative or his/her designee will make notification to those attending the event that a hazardous weather condition exists and direct them to shelter.
- 4. There are very limited provisions for sheltering participants in the event of severe weather.
- 5. This event will follow the 30-30 Rule for lightning. If lightning is observed and thunder is heard within 30 seconds, the event will be delayed until 30 minutes have passed since thunder was last heard.

D. Fire

- 1. If a specific hazard has been identified as an increased risk of fire at this event, event manager will work with the Fire Department to determine how to address the hazard.
- 2. All event staff will be instructed on the safe use of Portable Fire Extinguishers.
- 3. If cooking is intended, you must contact the fire department and
 - a) Must have a valid fire extinguisher, 2A10BC

- b) Each space is allowed 1 LP tank per cooking device. All LP tanks are to be secured in an approved manner (tied, strapped, chained, etc.)
- c) No cooking shall be allowed under a tent. Cooking shall be a minimum of 20' away from tents/canopies.
- d) Cooking must be on a non-combustible surface (grease collection material generally required under cooking and food service areas)
- 4. Fire Inspectors may be required to do an inspection of your event (depends on size and nature of the event), contact the Fire Department for guidelines
- 5. All tents/canopies used for cooking shall have a FLAME SPREAD Certification attached to the tent.
- 6. Should an incident occur that requires the Fire Department, 911 will be utilized to request this resource. The caller should have the following information available to the 911 operator: nature of emergency, location, and contact person with callback number.

E. Medical Emergencies

- 1. As with any outdoor event, there is potential for injury to the participants. The types of injuries are various and include those that are heat related as well as traumatic injuries.
- 2. Event manager shall contact the Fire Department to determine if there is a need for on-site Emergency Medical Services at this event.
- 3. Should an incident occur that requires Emergency Medical Services to be called to this event, the caller will have the following information available to give to the 911 Center:
 - a) nature of emergency
 - b) precise location
 - c) contact person with callback number

F. Law Enforcement

- The need for constant Law Enforcement presence at this event

- 2. Should an incident occur that requires Law Enforcement, to be called to this event, the caller will have the following information available to give to the 911 Center:
 - a) nature of emergency
 - b) precise location
 - c) contact person with callback number

G. Emergency Vehicle Access

- 1. Access for Emergency Vehicles will be maintained at all times.
- 2. 20' Fire Lanes are required to be kept open at events.
- 3. A 14' minimum height clearance requirement for anything that goes over a street or fire lane
- 4. Participants and spectators will be directed to park in approved areas and not to obstruct protective features, sidewalks or public throughways.
- 5. Crowd control will be managed by: Henry Vilas Zoo Duty Manager.
- 6. Parking for vendor and staff vehicles will be: Henry Vilas Zoo Parking Lots and surrounding street parking.
- 7. Parking for attendee vehicles will be: Henry Vilas Zoo Parking Lots and surrounding street parking).
