2. <u>77164</u> Transition to Recreated Transportation Commission

Director of Transportation Tom Lynch provided verbal reports and was available for questions. 6/21/23 is planned to be the first meeting for the recreated Transportation Commission.

3. <u>78227</u> Approval of Transportation Demand Management Fees

Parking Division Manager Stefanie Cox provided verbal reports and, along with Lynch, was available for questions. Webber moved to approve TC resolution 60, seconded by Wasniewski. With no further discussion, the motion passed by voice vote/other.

4. <u>78130</u>

Repealing and Recreating Section 16.23 of the Madison General Ordinances to Update Land Subdivision Regulations.

Lynch provided verbal reports and, along with Ped/Bike Administrator Renee Callaway with Traffic Engineering and City Traffic Engineer Yang Tao, was available for questions.

Kliems moved to Return to Lead with the Recommendation for Approval, seconded by Webber. With no further discussion, the motion passed by voice vote/other.

Supporting and approving the City of Madison's application to the US Department of Transportation (USDOT) by the Vision Zero team for a Safe Streets and Roads for All Implementation grant, the acceptance of the grant, and authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to execute a grant agreement with USDOT or its designee, if awarded the grant.

Kliems moved to RECOMMEND TO COUNCIL TO ADOPT - REPORT OF OFFICER, seconded by Webber. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

6.* <u>78072</u>

Approving roadway geometry for the reconstruction of John Nolen Drive from North Shore Drive to Lakeside Street. (4th AD, 13th AD)

Engineer Chris Petykowski with City Engineering provided verbal reports and, along with Aaron Steger with KL Engineering, Callaway, Traffic Engineer Gretchen Aviles-Pineiro and Tao, was available for questions.

Webber moved to Return to Lead with the Following Recommendation(s): Move approval of the geometrics as presented, with the recommendation that the bicycle portion of the path along John Nolen Drive be widened, and the recommendation for 10/11 foot width car lanes on North Shore Drive, and the recommendation that the usable space on the islands be made bigger and the approaches across the railroad tracks be made more straight, and the recommendation that the staging space at the east side of the crossing of John Nolen Drive be made bigger, seconded by Wasniewski. After much discussion, the motion passed by voice vote/other, with Kliems and Jess abstaining.
