## Why do we need Neighborhood Indicators?

- We have a lot of timely data, but it's at the wrong geography
  - Monthly employment numbers at the county level
- Employment by sector at the MSA level
- We also have detailed data, but it gets old fast
- US Census comes once every 10 years
- What we want is something timely and at the right geography to let us know how our neighborhoods are doing

### Reminder: This is a pilot

- Roster of indicators may not be complete
- Modeling has been done for only a handful of neighborhoods
- The goal is to demonstrate the capacity and functionality of a potential full-scale system
- Feedback from users will help refine and improve the package


# What is a "Neighborhood"?


- Hard to pick the <u>best</u> geography

- ♦ Chose modified neighborhood organization boundaries


  - NH orgs are not wall-to-wall coverage

  - But... these represent what most people feel is a neighborhood


