WHAT IS THE YOUTH GOVERNANCE PROGRAM?

WHAI IS THE YOUTH GOVERNANCE PROGRAM?

The Dane County Youth Governance Program (YGP) offers unique opportunities for youth leadership development and empowerment through direct participation in county government.

It provides real-life learning experiences about the functioning of local government.

Allows youth to contribute to community issues.

Helps youth develop into confident, capable, and independent leaders.













YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

Develop essential skills for success within and beyond the program.

CIVIC ENGAGEMENT

Meaningful and long-term engagement platform with local government.

Youth positively contribute to their communities.

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BACKGROUND OF YGP









The Youth Governance Program is part of UW-Extension's partnership with county boards and city councils and their committees to include youth representation in several Wisconsin counties.

















OUR HISTORY

This initiative was created to cultivate youth leadership, which is crucial for building strong communities. National trends emphasizing youth civic service and education underscored the need for such programs and in response to the lack of leadership opportunities for youth in local communities, several counties in Wisconsin developed and implemented the Youth in Governance program, starting with Kenosha in 2007.

SPECIAL STUDY COMMITTEE ON YOUTH GOVERNANCE

To develop the program with community input.

APPROVAL AND LAUNCH

Program was approved by the Dane County Board of Supervisors in January 2012, with the first cohort inducted in June 2012





EARLY STAGES

Informal conversations between Board Supervisors, Extension Staff, and Youth Commission staff and research into existing youth governance models.

YOUTH SUMMIT

At the Wisconsin Association of County Extension Committees garnered positive feedback and significant interest from youth and adult

CREATING A DANE COUNTY BOARD YOUTH GOVERNANCE PROGRAM

Earlier this year, the Dane County Board created a study committee to consider creation of a youth governance program. The committee has made a report to the County Board, recommending creation of a youth governance program within the Dane County Board's legislative structure. The committee envisions active youth participation in the County Board's standing committee matters and specified an implementation approach including eligibility criteria, selection processes, ementioning opportunities, and outreach to ensure participation.

The study committee agreed to begin the youth governance program on a smaller scale at the outset, limiting youth participation on the standing committees of the Dane County Board, except the Executive Committee. Study committee members also agreed to support and seek provisions for mileage reimbursement for youth participants.

The Youth Governance Program would be created in the Dane County Extension Department, with assistance provided by the Department of Human Services' Youth Commission Coordinator. Program parameters follow:

- Youth members will have a non-binding advisory vote on all County Board standing committees, but
 will be given the same opportunities for committee participation and involvement as elected county
 supervisors. Committee closed sessions may include youth members at the call of the chair. Youth
 members are expected to sign confidentiality agreements to apply to these situations. Youth members
 will not be counted for purpose of quorum, and committee minutes should record their votes separately
 as advisory.
- Two youth representatives will be selected to serve on each of the following standing committees, or their counterparts should the standing committee structure change in future years:
 - Personnel & Finance
 - Health & Human Needs
 - Public Protection & Judiciary
 - Public Works & Transportation
 - Environment, Agriculture & Natural Resources
 - Zoning & Land Regulation
- Youth will serve one-year terms from June to June. Program applicants may reapply for a second
 term. Eligible youths include those in grades 9-12, and participants must be Dane County residents.
 Applications for the one-year term shall be sent to the Dane County Extension Department by March 1.
- County Extension staff will conduct an initial screening of the applications. The County Extension
 Committee will conduct brief interviews of the screened applicants, and make final recommendations.
 Finalists will be forwarded to the County Board Chair for official appointment. Youth members will be
 notified of their appointment in May.
- Information dissemination and the youth candidate selection process will be administered by the Dane
 County Extension Department. County Extension staff will develop and disseminate program
 materials to area high schools, alternative schools, youth organizations, and home school networks,
 with the anticipation of youth participation on County Board standing committees beginning with the
 2012-2014 County Board term.

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THE DANE COUNTY YOUTH GOVERNANCE PROGRAM





The program aims to empower youth through direct participation in local government, bringing their voices to the forefront of community issues, and fostering the development of future leaders.









SELECTION PROCESS

- Eligible Dane County youth in grades 10-12 apply for a one-year term starting in September.
- They are appointed to various Dane County Board committees and commissions.
- Each year, up to 12-18 youth are selected for YGP and each youth is matched with a supervisor-mentor who provides guidance and support throughout their term.

MENTORSHIP & SUPPORT

They provide resources, advocate for the youth, and ensure a safe, welcoming environment.









COMMITTEE PARTICIPATION

• YGP youth have the same opportunities for committee participation and involvement as elected county supervisors, except that they have a non-binding advisory vote.

EDUCATIONAL MEETINGS


• Youth representatives attend bimonthly cohort education meetings to connect with peers, deepen their learning, and enhance their leadership and civic engagement skills.

CHALLENGES IN ENGAGING YOUTH



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Adapting to changing interest and needs of youth

Solution: Stay in tune with current trends and issues affecting youth by conducting regular surveys and feedback sessions.

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Retention

Solution: Create a supportive and inclusive environment that values youth input and ideas. Provide ongoing opportunities to keep participants motivated and engaged. Offer leadership roles within the program to encourage continued involvement and ownership.

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Recruitment that representative of the County

Solution: Implement targeted outreach strategies to schools, community centers, and youth organizations that serve diverse populations. Engage with community leaders and influencers to help spread the word and encourage participation





ENGAGING YOUTH IN LOCAL GOVERNMENT

MEANINGFUL PARTICIPATION

- Real opportunity to participate in local government decision-making
- Hands-on experience gives them a sense of ownership and responsibility

YOUTH-CENTERED APPROACH

- Program is designed with the needs and interests of youth in mind.
- Provides a platform for youth to express their opinions, share their perspectives, and contribute their ideas.

MENTORSHIP & SUPPORT

A supervisor-mentor who provides guidance, support, and encouragement throughout their term

SKILL DEVELOPMENT

YGP focuses on developing essential skills in youth, such as communication, teamwork, critical thinking, and problem-solving

COMMUNITY IMPACT

Youth have the opportunity to make a tangible impact on their communities
