- Staff and Alder Verveer recently met to review sidewalk café outdoor overnight storage for café
 equipment. Staff reviewed the steps and tasks required to complete the Ordinance change and
 implement them. Due to limited staff capacity, we are not able to do the work required to
 complete this change during the 2023-2024 vending season.
- I have met with Joshua Perkins, Director of Food and Nutrition for the Madison Metropolitan School District regarding their work with REAP and their UpRoot Food Truck. We also discussed daily vending adjacent to school property and special/community events on school property outside of the school day.

MMSD is going through the application process for a Transient Food Stand License from PHMDC to participate in Parks Alive this summer to preview their new school lunch menu and future outreach and programming partnerships with REAP.

We will continue to work through all the approval steps as needed.

- On Saturday ONLY, the Capitol Square is now closed to vehicular traffic between 8a-1:30p.
 Historically, busses are re-routed on Saturdays during the Dane County Farmers Markets. This is
 a proactive move by the City to keep the large and increasingly growing crowds safe while

- Carts in Parks is continuing to provide opportunities for food vendors across Madison.

- Parks Alive had a rocky start due to air quality and weather issues. A number of events had to be
 cancelled at the last minute. We have developed a standard practice for cancellations from the
 City side and for the vendors. We are requiring a 24-hour notice from vendors or they are pulled
 from the program. If the City gives, less than 24 hours' notice for a cancellation the vendor will
 still be paid their stipend.
