



Food Access Improvement Map Update September 14, 2022

- Spatial analysis- conducted in GIS
- New boundaries- Future City of Madison boundary (includes Town of Madison Attachment)
- NRT Boundaries
- Scale: Census Block Groups

#### Dataset

- USDA 2019 Food Access Research Atlas
- Census Block Groups within future City of Madison boundaries
- Environmental Justice

### Data Sources

- USDA
  - Overview of food access indicators for low-income and supermarket accessibility by census tract
  - Food access measures based on 2019 ACS data
- Race and Ethnicity
  - 2020 Census data
- Major Stores
  - Comprehensive Plan
- Environmental Justice
  - Areas based on the concentration of low-income and racial/ethnic minority residents.
    - Including Limited English Proficient (LEP) and zero-car households
    - Adjusted based on the percentage of students eligible for free and reduced priced lunch.
  - Tier 1- Priority Areas
  - Tier 2- Non-Priority Areas
