

Hi Peter.

Long time no see - since our kids were in boy scouts together I believe!

Anyway, I have a couple of comments and am not sure I will be able to make the meeting tonight.

- 1. The 33 year old community garden group, as I understand it, adopted their non-profit status last year *only* to position themselves to possibly buy the state owned land they were using. That did not happen as you know, but their status as a non-profit might now seem as though they are a non-public group. They have always been and remain now, a group with a first come, first serve policy to the general public. The intent has always been to allow any-income people of the area a chance to grow some of their own food. However, the low-income people living in the apartments have taken advantage of the opportunity.
- 2. Also by UHFNA bylaws, the apartment dwellers are not allowed to be members of the association. They have no choice for membership in our association so their participation in our discussions has been somewhat limited due to this policy. I understand that Chris Schmidt included representatives in this discussion, but the majority of the gardeners would be excluded for this reason.
- 3. I am a commission member of the City of Madison Community Development Authority, which owns the city's public housing projects, and many additional low income housing units. We have included Community Gardens in many of our projects and support the use of them, especially for our residents that want to add to their food sources.
- 4. Due to the suggested locations of the community gardens on the edges of Rennebohm Park, and in areas of low usage, I am in favor of using this space for the gardens. I understand that the density of our neighborhood is increasing, but as the wonderful planned community that we have been, I think we should welcome this usage in our park. By design, the University allowed for all incomes within this neighborhood and I would like to see us encourage that to continue. The two park areas being proposed for garden use are not ever utilized that I see when I walk through the park. I can also see some positive reasons to include the gardens, including showcasing native plants that will thrive in our area something I would enjoy learning about myself. It would not be unreasonable to ask for certain design features to attractively enclose the gardens which would make them a very positive addition to the park. We have done that with some of the CDA gardens.

So please register my vote in favor of both garden sites within Rennebohm Park. As a neighbor I would like to see what is being grown, would like to give local residents the chance to grow their own food and would like to include this use into our park. Let me know if I can offer any further help in this matter.
