

Background Information

Goodman Community Center - Program H. High School Achievement

- In 2010, the Goodman Community Center received funding from Community Resources for two separate high school programs.
Program H. - Goodman High School Leadership (\$9,288)
Program L.- Lussier Teen Center (\$48,182)
- In the 2011-2012 application, the Goodman Community Center applied for one High School focused program in place of the two previously funded programs.
- The column listing 2010 funding for each program on the spread sheet that was created for use by the CSC during the 2011-2012 funding process only included the amount for Program H. – Goodman High School Leadership (\$9,288).
- The CSC based their preliminary recommendations for the Goodman Community Center - Program H. High School Achievement on an incorrect 2010 funding level (\$9,288)
- To keep the Goodman Community Center - Program H. High School Achievement program at the 2010 level, the correct allocation would be \$57,470. This is the total of both programs funded in 2010 (\$9,288 + \$48,182)

Currently we have 80 children enrolled for fall program.

20 are qualified for WI shares with their co-payments scholarshipped by Goodman

40 names can be found on our waiting list.

Parent listed reasons why they are not eligible for WI shares:

- Stay at home mother
- Family qualifies for City funding but accreditation renewal is not yet complete
- Individual income is over by a small amount
- Family income is slightly over but household has 6 members—larger families with 4+ children struggle to pay for childcare
- Mom is waiting for green card
- Mom is enrolled part-time in school and does not work
- Self-employed parent, income varies greatly from month to month
- Divorced with no child support
- Eldest children enrolled in college, limited finances available
- Unemployed father/Grandparent living in the home
- New born child, unable to work hours
- Checks garnished each month due to medical debt
- Parent work part-time hours with cash tips, varying
- Roommate does not contribute to household income
- Job requires mom to be on call, hours unsure from week to week
- Parent receives limited SSI payment monthly—since they are home, they are not eligible
- Joint ownership of a home without either parent living there
- Neither parents has a social security number
- Married couple does not have official custody of husband's daughter
- Refusal to participate
- Legality of work or income
