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This letter relates to file **91512** concerning the proposal to tear down the buildings at 5534 Medical Circle and 5555 Odana Road:

To the Plan Commission members:

I have two grandchildren enrolled in the Montessori Children's House. I'm also a former resident of Madison where I've had family since 1916. The houses my great-grandfather and grandfather built are both listed in the historic registry. I care about the essence of Madison, its history and its quality of life.

I ask you to preserve places such as the Erdman buildings in Medical Circle, places where the eye and the spirit can rest; spaces where the scale of the buildings is in tune with children and humans of all ages; areas of gentle beauty that distinguish Madison from the acres of close, oppressive high-rise residential developments outside the Beltline. Concerning Medical Circle, please be the conservator of Madison history and Madison quality of life.

As for the Montessori Children's House, If you preserve the Marshall Erdman buildings, you preserve the kind of environment in which children and their families thrive—one close to the ground, one in which not all traces of what is old have been erased, one which fosters a feeling of stability. I urge you to prioritize the value of this group of calm, integrated, modest buildings over any potential profits eyed by developers.
