SUBJECT: **2015 Fourth Quarter Traffic Enforcement Activity Report**

The information provided in this document represents the Madison Police Department's traffic enforcement and safety activity for the fourth quarter of 2015.

It is the goal of the Madison Police Department to make our streets safer for all users thru education and enforcement. We feel that our streets should be safely shared by motorists, bicyclists and pedestrians.

Traffic Citations

The Madison Police Department issued **5,139** traffic citations (**3,120** citations were for hazardous violations and **2,019** citations were for non-hazardous violations) in the 4th quarter of 2015. These numbers reflect a decrease over the total number of citations (**5,532**) issued in the 4th quarter of 2014, but more than the (**4,339**) citations that the Madison Police Department issued for the 4th quarter of 2013.

For the year 2015, the Madison Police Department issued a total of **23,316** citations. These numbers reflect an increase over the total number of citations (**22,246**) issued in 2014 and 2013 (**22,878**).

T.E.S.T. (Traffic Enforcement Safety Team)

Of the **5,139** total citations issued in the 4th quarter, **2,343** citations (**1,214** hazardous and **1,129** non-hazardous, were issued by the Traffic Enforcement Safety Team. They also issued (**1,427**) written warnings. These numbers represent a decrease from the total number of citations (**2,546**) issued by TEST officers during the 4th quarter of 2014 and an increase of the (**1,912**) citations in the 4th quarter of 2013.

For the year 2015, the Traffic Enforcement Safety Team issued a total of **10,496** citations. These numbers reflect an increase of the totals from 2014 (**8,173**) and 2013 (**9,173**).

Speeding

2015 4th quarter citations for speeding totaled **1,412**. This is a decrease compared with the **1,677** citations issued in the 4th quarter of 2014, but an increase from the **827** citations issued in the 4th quarter of 2013.

For 2015, the total citations issued for speeding is (**7,574**). This reflects an increase of the totals from 2014 (**6107**) and 2013 (**6916**).

Red Signal Violations

During 4th quarter 2015, **239** red signal violation citations were issued. **162** red signal violations were written during 4th quarter of 2014.

For 2015, the total citations issued for Red Signal Violation was **830**. This is an increase from the **629** citations issued in 2014.

Traffic Complaint Hotline (266-4822)

The Traffic Complaint Hotline received **98** citizen calls during the 4th quarter of 2015. **59** warning letters were sent as a result of reported violations. This compares with **149** complaints and **95** letters during the 4th quarter of 2015.

For the year 2015, there were a total of **598** calls to the Traffic Complaint Hotline. A total of **366** warning letters were sent out as a result of reported violations. These numbers represent a decrease compared to 2014 totals of **806** calls and **369** warning letters.

School Zones

School zones violation reports from Crossing Guards resulted in **66** warning letters being sent and **89** citations issued for observed violations in the 4th quarter of 2015.

For 2015, there were a total of **263** warning letters and **362** citations issued for school zone violations reports from Crossing Guards.

Traffic Enforcement/Safety Grants

(12) Alcohol Enforcement, **(5)** Pedestrian Safety overtime grant initiatives were scheduled for the 4th quarter of 2015. These were coordinated through the Department of Transportation, Bureau of Transportation Safety. The grant initiatives focused on Impaired Driving (OMVWI) and Pedestrian Safety. These **17** grant initiatives resulted in **455** citations and **251** warnings.

The following are locations where traffic grants were deployed during the 4th quarter:

For the year 2015, there were **123** grant deployments. These included Alcohol Enforcement, Pedestrian Safety, Speed Enforcement, and Bicycle Safety. These deployments resulted in a total of **2722** citations and **1039** warnings being issued. In addition, the Madison Police Department participated in a Wisconsin Bureau of Traffic Safety seat belt enforcement mobilization initiative in June. The results of this department wide initiative yielded **830** citations and **466** warnings being issued.

Significant Crashes

In the 4th quarter of 2015, Traffic Specialists investigated **3** significant traffic crashes. These crashes resulted in **2** deaths. Also investigated and followed up on **10** crashes with injuries or great bodily harm.

2015 Fatal Crashes

1. 03/13/15
800 N. Stoughton Rd
MV/FO – a motor vehicle at high speeds lost control and struck a fixed object, killing the driver of the vehicle.
2. 03/28/15
N. Stoughton Rd at E. Washington Av
MV/CMV – a motor vehicle drove into the back of a semi that was stopped for a red signal at E. Washington Av. The driver of the motor vehicle died as a result of the injuries sustained in the collision.
3. 04/13/15
400 Commerce Dr.
MV/Off Roadway – A driver had a medical event and died, causing the vehicle to drive off the roadway into a ditch.
4. 05/14/15
5800 Femrite Dr.
MV/FO – a motor vehicle rammed into a bridge abutment at high speeds with the operator not restrained in the vehicle.

5. 06/10/15
8000 Raymond Rd
MV/Bicycle – a bicyclist traveling south on a bike path entered into the roadway as a motor vehicle was approaching westbound. The motor vehicle was unable to avoid the bicyclist, who died as a result of the injuries sustained in the collision.
6. 06/18/15
N. Stoughton Rd at E Washington Av
MV/Ped – a motor vehicle operator increased speed and intentionally ran over a pedestrian in the marked crosswalk. Operator has been charged with 1st degree intentional homicide.
7. 07/13/15
University Av at Ridge St
MV/Bicycle – a bicyclist traveling north on Ridge St entered onto University Av against the traffic light. The motor vehicle operator was unable to avoid the bicyclist, who died as a result of the injuries sustained in the collision.
8. 09/05/15
Nakoosa Rd
MV/Ped – a motor vehicle operator lost control of his vehicle and drove up onto a sidewalk, striking and killing a pedestrian. The driver has been charged with OWI Homicide.
9. 11/23/15
S. Stoughton Rd/Cottage Grove Rd
MV/Off Road- a single motor vehicle drove off roadway on NB S. Stoughton Rd at Cottage Grove Rd. The lone occupant was ejected from vehicle and pronounced dead at the scene.
10. 12/15/15
MV/PED- a vehicle was exiting a Independent Living Retirement Community facility. As the vehicle exited the enclosed parking structure, the vehicle struck a pedestrian that was on the sidewalk. The pedestrian was a resident of the facility. The investigation is still pending.
