6. Product/Service Description:

DAIS uses the majority of project funds to provide safe accommodations in local motels for victims of domestic abuse when there is no space at the shelter. A smaller amount of funds pay for lock changes or assistance with rent or security deposit with the outcome to avoid homelessness. Motel vouchers are used for DV victims when there is no space an available at the shelter, when the DV victim is male, or when the victim requires handicapped accessible accommodations and another resident currently occupies the accommodations at the shelter.

7. Anticipated Accomplishments (Numbers/Type/Outcome):

- 100% of the anticipated 20 households who are assisted through a motel voucher will be kept safe from abuse.
- 100% of the anticipated 25 households who are assisted to remain in their own home or move to another rental unit will be safe from abuse.

Total Cost/Total Beneficiaries Equals: \$29,000 / 45 households = \$646

CD Office Funds/CD-Eligible Beneficiaries Equals: \$29,000 / 45 households = \$646

CD Office Funds as Percentage of Total Budget: 100%

8. Staff Review (content, strengths/weaknesses, issues):

The 2008 budget on the 5th page under "total cost of program" in "2009 proposed" should read \$29,000 rather than \$29,580.

Funds provide much needed safety net for victims of domestic abuse who are otherwise unable to access shelter because there is no space available. 2008 is the first year that the CDBG Office is contracting with DAIS for this service. However, the CDBG Office had other contracts for services and capital improvements using ESG funds in the past.
