



616 E Mifflin Street

- Constructed 1910
- Demolition of shed at rear of property, not the brick house
- The Reynolds family lived on the block as early as 1875
- In 1888, Anna Reynolds operated a livery stable and hauling firm in a non-extant barn at this location
- Anna's son Edward built the brick house and served as alderperson while living here
- Edward's son Henry then lived here and was elected mayor in 1960





609-617 E Dayton Street

- Constructed 1929, additions in 1950 and 1956
- H.E. Reynolds Warehouse and Garage
- Architect Ed Tough
- The livery stable and hauling firm founded in 1888 became Reynolds Transfer and Storage, still operated in the neighborhood by the Reynolds family
- Longest-lived transfer & storage business for which a building exists
- Only hauling firm for which a building remains from the preautomobile era
