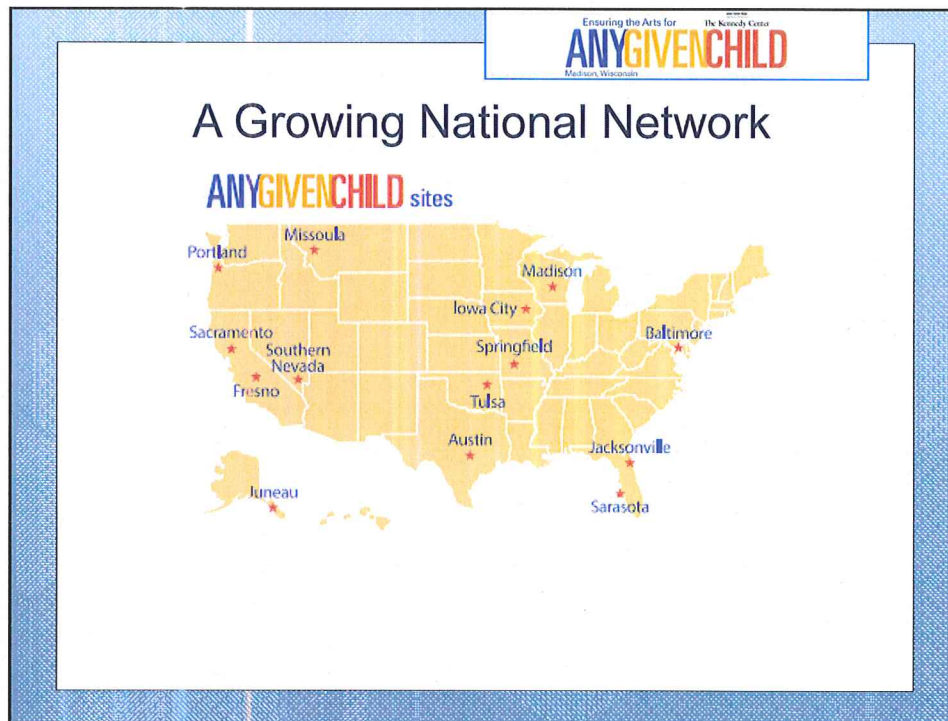

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The Kennedy Center's goal of the **Any Given Child** program is to create full **access** to and **equity** in **arts education** programs and resources for **K-8** students.





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- ### PHASE 1
- o Kennedy Center Application - March 2013
 - o Identified 35 Community Arts Team members
 - o Kennedy Center Site Visit - May 2013
 - o Madison named 12th "Any Given Child" City – June 2013
 - o Mayor/Superintendent/Overture CEO Press Event – July 2013
 - o Monthly Strategic Planning with KC Consultants – 2013-14
 - o September 2013 – May 2014: Community Arts Team
 - o May 2014 – September 2014: New Governance Structure
 - o Phase 1 Report released – October 17, 2014

Any Given Child Madison Surveys

- Arts Organization Surveys
 - More than 150 total responses
 - 42 Arts Organizations represented
 - Programmatic and attitudinal questions were included
- School Personnel Survey
 - More than 1500 responses including teachers, administrators, and others
 - Primarily attitudinal questions included
- School Mapping Tool
 - 32 Elementary and 12 Middle School
 - School principals were asked to identify arts programming schools
 - MMSD Data Team provided school arts enrollment information

The Community Arts Team found:

- General Music and Visual Arts are taught by certified arts teachers in all K-5 schools and nearly all students have access.
- There are no K-8 **Dance** or **Theatre** specialists
 (Note: Dance is taught as a unit through physical education classes in some K-8 schools)
- Very few students are exposed to instruction in **spoken word, media arts, and arts integration.**
- **Hours** of music/art instruction varies greatly in 7th & 8th grade



The Community Arts Team found:

- Site-based allocation and scheduling models at secondary level impact equity and access.
- School access to **arts organizations/teacher artists varies greatly**
- There is no quality or training system for community artists or arts organizations



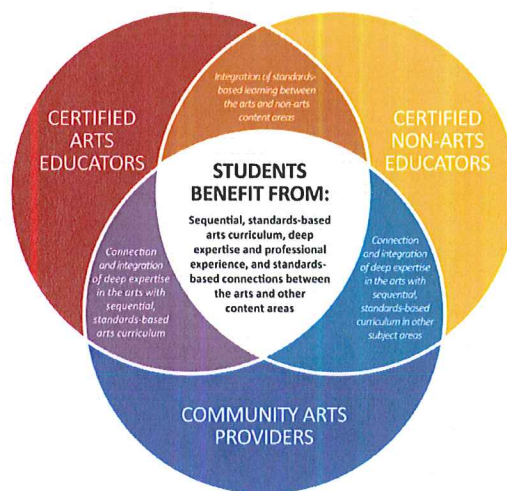





1. **Cultivate leaders and develop and sustain systems**
