SUBJECT: Tenney-Lapham Neighborhood Plan Amendment

The Traffic Engineering Division supports the proposed amendment to the Tenney-Lapham Neighborhood Plan. The Division recommends that Livingston Street between Mifflin Street and Dayton Street remain open to all modes of transportation. A complete uninterrupted street network is important to provide circulation and to prevent overloading of individual streets in the network. Closure of Livingston street is likely to result in a significant increase in vehicular traffic using Mifflin Street from any development on the 700 block of Mifflin Street. This may also result in additional traffic from the new developments on the 700 block and 800 blocks of East Washington Avenue using Mifflin Street to circulate. Mifflin Street is a Bicycle Boulevard and an important bicycle connection for the near east side. Increases in motor vehicular traffic as a result of the closure of Livingston Street would likely deteriorate the quality of the Mifflin Street Bicycle Boulevard. In addition the closure of Livingston Street is likely to increase traffic on Patterson Street and may result in overloading of the Patterson Street and East Washington intersection as well as the Johnson Street and Patterson Street intersection.

The Traffic Engineering Division believes if Livingston Street remains open to all modes of traffic, adequate transportation infrastructure exists to support high density residential development on the 710 E. Mifflin Street Site. Traffic Engineering will be requesting a TIA for the 710 E. Mifflin site to confirm the adequacy of the transportation network upon the applicant's submittal for conditional use approval.
