PEDESTRIAN/BICYCLE PROJECTS

TRANSPORTATION ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM

When Congress passed the 1991 Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act (ISTEA), it established a Transportation Enhancement Program administered by the State for funding specific types of projects. The Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21), which reauthorized ISTEA, continued the enhancement program.

ISTEA clearly defined what was meant by transportation enhancement "activities" that "enhance" a transportation project or an area served by a project. The categories of eligible transportation enhancement projects used by WisDOT include the following:

- 1. Provision of facilities for pedestrians and bicycles
- 2. Acquisition of scenic easements and scenic or historic sites
- 3. Scenic or historic programs
- 4. Landscaping and other scenic beautification
- 5. Historic preservation
- 6. Rehabilitation and operation of historic transportation buildings, structures or facilities (including historic railroad facilities and canals)
- 7. Preservation of abandoned railway corridor (including the conversion and use thereof for pedestrian or bicycle trails)
- 8. Control and removal of outdoor advertising
- 9. Archeological planning and research
- 10. Mitigation of water pollution due to highway runoff

In addition, four new project categories became eligible Transportation Enhancement activities with the passage of TEA-21. They are: provision of safety education for bicyclists and pedestrians; transportation museums; tourist information centers; and wildlife tunnels.

WisDOT has also in the past administered the STP-Discretionary Program, which is intended to promote alternatives to automobile travel. Bicycle and pedestrian facility projects are among those eligible for funding. WisDOT created the Statewide Multimodal Improvement Program (SMIP), incorporating Enhancement and STP-Discretionary funding. Statewide, \$17.94 million was available for SMIP projects for Fiscal Years (FYs) 2002-2003, and \$18.94 million was available for 2004-2005. Only Enhancement Program funds were available for FYs 2006-2007. The State legislature eliminated the STP-Discretionary Program. A total of \$9 million was available statewide for the two years.
