Moms on a Mission: \$46,138

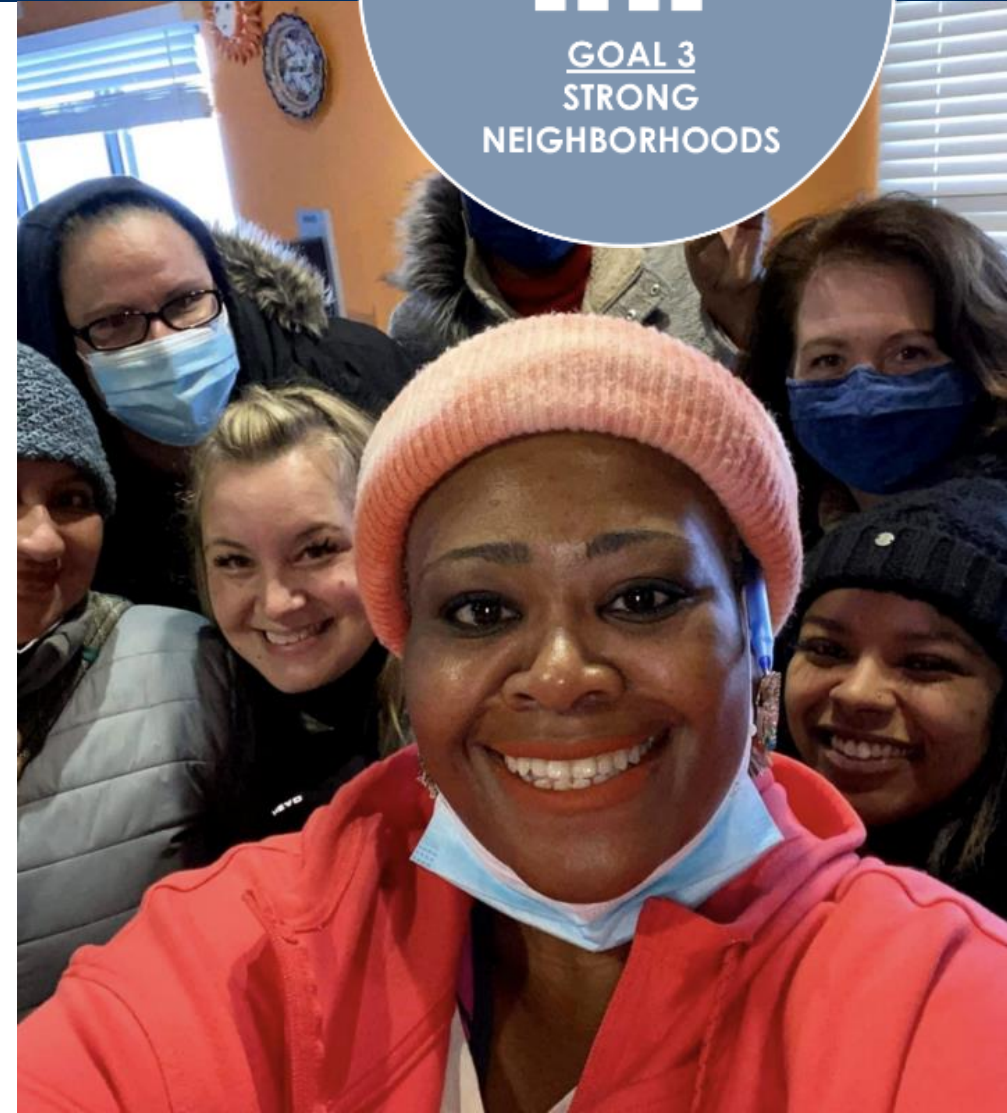


PROGRAM SUMMARY

The program places trained volunteers in East High School lunch rooms to provide community-responsive, trauma informed violence prevention and interruption services for students.

FUNDS

Support staffing and direct aide for students



African Center for Community Development, Inc: \$65,000



PROGRAM SUMMARY

Program aims to reduce domestic violence among African Immigrant communities, partnering with DV service providers for training and providing direct service through partnerships with Madison Black Nurses, as doing outreach work.

FUNDS

Staffing, translation resources, and community resources and increase outreach workshops for community leaders and community engagement



Dear Diary, Inc: \$75,255

PROGRAM SUMMARY

Program is designed to empower Black girls and women aged 14-21 in Madison, WI, by hosting bi-weekly, community-based sessions, the program fosters an environment that shifts mindsets, heals trauma, enhances self-esteem and identity, and strengthens community and family.

FUNDS

Staffing and increases supplies for sessions



YWCA Madison: \$72,000

PROGRAM SUMMARY

Supporting restorative justice practices in community centers and schools across the county. Curriculum provided in schools and at each community based setting, education and participation in the Circle Process (best practice for shared vulnerability, empathetic listening, and community building); and discussions on social justice topics to support feelings of belonging and affirmation.

FUNDS

Staffing of supervising and implementation of programming



Madison Public Library Foundation: \$58,650

PROGRAM SUMMARY

Making Justice is a community-focused, art-based learning program for at-risk and court-involved teens in Madison, developed to address racial discrepancies in juvenile detention.

FUNDS

Funds are used to increase the number of workshop artists by increasing funds for contracting with artist, and increase supplies for program



MAKING JUSTICE.



Allied Wellness Center: \$76,472

PROGRAM SUMMARY

Program is designed to host healing groups for Allied resident who have experienced violence. Groups of 8-10 residents led by community health workers (CHWs) and the Program Manager, an experienced psychoeducational group facilitator.

FUNDS

Used to launch this program, with funds for staffing, childcare, and other resident resources.



Rape Crisis Center (RCC): \$50,000

PROGRAM SUMMARY

Supporting clients not reporting to the law enforcement through other forms of advocacy and addressing lost access to Wisconsin Crime Victim Compensation Program funds.

FUNDS

Used for advocacy services staffing and victim resources.



UNIDOS Against Domestic Violence: \$31,485

PROGRAM SUMMARY

Proposal seeks funding to enhance initiatives to provide cultural and linguistic spaces for healing to survivors of domestic and sexual violence in Dane County, as well as working with Roots4Change addressing maternal and child health. R4C will provide five workshops and three experimental activities for UNIDOS clients.

FUNDS

Staffing, supplies and partnership with Roots4Change.
