

- Part I is now operational and we are working actively on Part II opportunities
- Meeting with WDNR in December of 2013 and July of 2014 to discuss options. Both discussions were extremely productive and included:
 - Discussion of diverting stream event flow (not base) into a treatment pond and then returning to the creek.
 - Discussion of how to address the possible Mercury
 Methylation WDNR response on this is pending......

PART II - LOCATION





WILLOW CREEK

- While there are a good number of permits required to proceed with this project the WDNR has been supportive of the approach.










Possible project in Cherokee
