SUMMARY:

At its meeting of September 3, 2008, the Urban Design Commission **RECEIVED AN INFORMATIONAL PRESENTATION** for the Urban League of Greater Madison/Madison Public Library located at 2200 South Park Street. Appearing on behalf of the project were Mark A. Olinger, representing the CDA, and Steve Harms, Tri-North Builders. Harms provided overviews of modifications to the plans as follows:

- Pull the Urban League/library building back from Park Street an additional 5-feet to provide for enhancements along Park Street.
- The entry to the library has been reoriented to relate to both the building plaza and Park Street with either a proposed curve at the southeasterly corner of the building or a combination of angles to the façade of the building at its corner. The building has been designed to provide for the potential of additions to the one-story building.

Following the presentation the Commission noted the following:

- Appreciate the expression of a tower element on the building at the Buick Street entry with a different expression and treatment of the Urban League and library portions of the building including a good job of bringing Park Street into the building.
- Looking for more architecture right on Park Street, like distinguishing in-between uses with materials and distinguish tower element.
- Don't like diagonal cut-off; like architecture but move tree at plaza.
- Need to unify façade at the ground plane; use an art or slant with consistent treatment of building entries.
- Trouble with the lack of pedestrian spaces along pedestrian ways; look at how building relates to site.
- Consider eliminating the driveway entry to the south and slide the building off of the Buick Street entry to incorporate more greenspace along the Buick entry drive to become a real entry point and relate more to the future northeasterly corner building's plaza.
- Eliminate southerly drive aisle entry and use space to enhance plaza on south side of building.

- Need to see vehicular car routes on site to assail impacts.
- Concern with strong statement to provide a strong pedestrian connection along Park Street.
- Provide ways to connect Villager to neighborhood instead of internal to the site.
- Need to try to attempt to bring a pedestrian sense to the project.
- Need to understand the traffic context of the master plan.
- Need to make a building that looks like a library, civic including providing outside connections to make it work better inside and outside.

*NOTE: Applicable comments and conditions relevant to review of this project are also contained within the report for the "Amended Villager Master Plan," Agenda Item No. 1, September 3, 2008.

ACTION:

Since this was an INFORMATIONAL PRESENTATION, no formal action was taken by the Commission.

After the Commission acts on an application, individual Commissioners rate the overall design on a scale of 1 to 10, including any changes required by the Commission. The ratings are for information only. They are not used to decide whether the project should be approved. The scale is 1 = complete failure; 2 = critically bad; 3 = very poor; 4 = poor; 5 = fair; 6 = good; 7 = very good; 8 = excellent; 9 = superior; and 10 = outstanding. The overall ratings for this project are 4, 4, 5, 6 and 6.

General Comments:

- Service vehicle circulation is critical. "Tower" needs to be celebrated...more transparent?
- Needs a stronger presence on Park Street, perhaps more celebrating of knowledge, information delivery. Ped-friendly?
- Address driveway entry at Buick. Relationship to atrium architecture should be strengthened, but not imitative. Address Buick Street greenspace perhaps by moving building to south.
- Architecture looks like might be on good course. Unify south façade/public space.
- Library architecture should be iconic. It should communicate "library."
- Architecture really needs work. And design team needs to take seriously the need to coordinate with master plan.
