





### 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter Fatality Crash Diagram & Report (DT4000) Narrative





\*\*distances are approximate, diagram is not to scale

- Unit 1 was driving west on Raymond Road.
- Unit 2 was stopped at a stop sign on S. Gammon Road looking to turn left on Raymond road to go east on Raymond Road.
- Unit 1 was exceeding the speed limit according to witnesses (and the vehicle's "black box" which showed a speed of 90mph).
- Unit 2 attempted to turn left but was struck by Unit 1 on the driver's side killing the driver of Unit 2.
- Unit 1 driver had also been consuming alcohol, per his own admission.




### Fatal Crashes 2015 – 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter 2025






### Serious Injury and Fatal Crashes 2023 - Present

### Traffic Grants

- The Madison Police Department, in partnership with the Dane County Sheriff's Office, conduct extra patrols that, depending on the time of year, and focus on enforcing Wisconsin's alcohol, seatbelt, and speed laws.
- These additional enforcement efforts are made possible through traffic overtime grants provided by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation.
- The goal of these extra patrols is not only to enhance public safety, but to prevent needless tragedies.
- Traffic grant activity is not confined to just the High Injury Network. Because MPD collaborates with the DCSO on alcohol, seatbelt and speed grants, grant activity must be held on city streets that are also county highways (shared roadways).



### Traffic Grants

- All alcohol grant activity must take place after 6:00 p.m. on Friday and Saturday
- 50% of seatbelt grant activity must take place after 6:00 p.m.
- In addition to the grants, the Madison Police Department participates in the Wisconsin Department of Transportation's "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over" and "Click It or Ticket" campaigns.
- The City of Madison also manages our own Pedestrian/Bike grants that are funded by the State of Wisconsin DOT.

Location: 2100 BLK Pennsylvania Ave

Date/Time Frame: January 6<sup>th</sup>; 3p-7p

Number Of Officers: 4

Total Number Of Traffic Stops: 19

Additional Information: We began down one officer due to a sick-up that could not be filled by the pick list or last-minute holdover. The remaining 4 did great. Only one person was stopped for 50 MPH, as traffic was moving at such high speeds that I made the threshold to send officers at 52 MPH. The highlight of the grant was stopping a vehicle going 75 MPH. That driver received a reckless driving charge in addition to the speed violations. Thank you to the stop cars who worked very hard on this cold afternoon.

This traffic grant was a designated as a seatbelt grant with an emphasis on speed in the area. The grant didn't have great numbers but we did manage to get 11 stops, in which 10 of the stops was for speed and 1 was for a non-registration violation. This particular grant took place in a familiar place which was the 1000 block of E. Washington Ave.

PO Wipperfurth had a vehicle failed to yield to emergency vehicle. The vehicle was speeding at 44 MPH in a posted 25 MPH zone in 1000 block of E. Washington Ave. Vehicle was attempted to be stopped at 3:37:49PM 1300 block of E. Washington Ave and finally stopped at 3:40:33PM at 2509 E. Washington Ave. The total distance of the fail to yield was 1.1 miles. The total time of refusal to stop was 2 mins 44 seconds. The top speed was 39 MPH in posted 30 MPH zone. We had 10 violations for speed and 6 violations for equipment such as defective heal lamps and tail lamps. I was thankful for their work and definitely their drive to make the stops on this grant.

We had 4 active officers on this grant and got them all some work. We had one pedestrian cross E. Washington Ave from Brearly St and all the vehicles stopped for the pedestrian.

We had one vehicle take off weaving in and out of traffic, so that vehicle was let go, but made the #4 spot on the log sheet. I was thankful for their work.
