3. 11080 SUBSTITUTE - Creating new Section 7.55 to prohibit outdoor wood boilers, amending Sec. 1.08(4) to include citation authority for Director of Public Health

and amending, and amending Sec. 1.08(3) of the Madison General

Ordinances to establish a bail deposit for a violation.

Linda Karr, 4205 Elinor St, spoke in favor of a ban on outdoor wood boilers and provided a website to the Commission members for more information: http://woodgasification.spaces.live.com. She stated that her neighbor's wood

boiler chimney is very low (not above the roof line). Commissioner Rewey suggested that with a ban, any pre-existing outdoor wood boilers should be required to raise their chimneys 2 feet above surrounding roof lines.

As John Hausbeck, public health, was unable to attend the meeting, Commissioners decided to refer action on this item until December.

A motion was made by Bannerman, seconded by Rewey, to Refer to the COMMISSION ON THE ENVIRONMENT and should be returned by 12/15/2008. The motion passed by voice vote/other.

- 7. Involvement with the Yahara Lakes Legacy Partnership and the Yahara Lakes watershed issues in general.
- 8. Dark Sky Ordinance compliance
- 9. Developing a stormwater assessment protocol for the City of Madison
- 10. Progress of the Starkweather Creek watershed plan and what the COE can do to encourage more progress
- 5. <u>12716</u> Discussion of the Draft report of the CCOC Subcommittee on Committee Creation and Committee Rules

Members discussed potential changes to the order of business as outlined in the 2nd Draft Final Report and Recommendations of the Common Council Organizational Committee Subcommittee on Committee Creation and Committee Rules.

Members discussed the roll of the Commission on the Environment as an adivsory committee without independent authority, defining it as a "committee". Members were concerned that the chair would not be able to participate in discussions (but not voting) even if the committee voted to change the rules to allow it. Commissioner Bannerman stated that he would like to be able to serve beyond the 10-year term limit.

A motion was made by Pierce, seconded by Grant, to suggest a change to the CCOC Final Report that would allow individual committees/commissions/boards to make rule changes allowing the chair to speak during discussions and to extend the term limit beyond 10 years.
