

Below, please find a list of data points that the proposed BWC pilot will collect. This is from Dr. Turner's proposal.

Across all three trials the following measures are collected:

- i. The number of officers equipped with body-worn cameras;
- ii. The nature of the encounters that are recorded (e.g. Arrests, citations, execution of search warrants);
- iii. Topics identified during supervisor review of body-worn camera footage for purposes of training accompanied by descriptive data on the uses of this footage in individual or department-wide training;
- iv. The duration of encounters;
- v. The number and nature of use-of-force incidents captured by body-worn cameras;
- vi. The number and percentage of times that victims, witnesses, or residents request that the cameras be turned off;
- vii. The number and nature of body-worn camera policy violations by officers;
- viii. The number and nature of technical malfunctions;
- ix. The quantity of stored recording footage and associated costs;
- x. The outcomes of incidents captured on video, including whether an individual was charged with a crime and the nature of any such charges.
- xi. the number of times an officer was the subject of a complaint or discipline from incidents with body-worn camera footage, and the nature of the alleged violations and the outcomes.
- xii. The number of times that initial police-officer reports or charging recommendations are altered after officer or supervisor review of body- worn camera footage, and if charges are altered, the nature of the changes.
- xiii. The number of instances (and nature) when BWC data exonerated, or factored substantially into the exoneration of, an Officer accused of a violation of law or SOP.
